

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNLAWFUL CHOP SHOP ACTIVITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that "chop shop" is
- 2 street vernacular for a location where stolen motor vehicles, or
- 3 stolen motor vehicle parts, are taken to be altered to conceal
- 4 their true identity. Chop shop activity may include the theft
- 5 of motor vehicles and motor vehicle parts; defacing vehicle
- 6 identification numbers; re-stamping false vehicle identification
- 7 numbers into stolen vehicles; and the re-sale of these stolen
- 8 vehicles to unsuspecting, innocent buyers.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to establish the criminal
- 10 offenses of unlawful chop shop activity in the first and second
- 11 degrees and to provide for the forfeiture of property connected
- 12 with chop shop activity.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 15 to read as follows:

- 10 §708- Unlawful chop shop activity in the second degree.
- 11 (1) A person commits the offense of unlawful chop shop activity
- 12 in the second degree if the person commits unlawful chop shop
- 13 activity and the total value of all stolen motor vehicles or
- 14 stolen motor vehicle parts stored, transported, sold,
- 15 transferred, purchased, received, destroyed, dismantled,
- 16 disassembled, reassembled, or made unidentifiable by altering,
- 17 concealing, disguising, or removing the vehicle identification
- 18 number of the motor vehicle or motor vehicle parts by the person
- 19 is less than \$250,000, but equal to or greater than \$100,000.
- 20 (2) Unlawful chop shop activity in the second degree is a
- 21 class B felony.

1	§708- Forfeiture of property connected with chop shop
2	activity. Any motor vehicle, motor vehicle part, tool,
3	implement, or real property, possessed or used in violation of
4	this part, or any money obtained in violation of this part, may
5	be ordered forfeited to the State, subject to the requirements
6	of chapter 712A."
7	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun before its effective date.
10	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
