
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COVID-19 VACCINATION STATUS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 325, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§325- Misrepresentation of COVID-19 vaccination
5 status; falsification or alteration of COVID-19 vaccination
6 card; sale, distribution, or manufacture of falsified or altered
7 COVID-19 vaccination card. (a) It shall be a civil violation
8 for any person to intentionally, knowingly, or negligently:

9 (1) Misrepresent the person's COVID-19 vaccination status
10 to a business, church, nonprofit organization, or
11 governmental entity;

12 (2) Falsify, alter, or purchase a falsified or altered:

13 (A) COVID-19 vaccination card for personal use; or

14 (B) Printed document that details COVID-19
15 vaccination status for personal use; or

16 (3) Use a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card.



1 (b) Any person who violates subsection (a) shall be fined
2 \$1,000 for each separate violation.

3 (c) It shall be a civil violation for any person to:

4 (1) Sell; or

5 (2) Distribute or manufacture, regardless of whether that
6 person is compensated for the distribution or
7 manufacture,

8 a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card for use by
9 others. Any person who violates this subsection shall be fined
10 \$2,500 for each separate violation.

11 (d) The department of the attorney general shall enforce
12 this section and may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to carry
13 out its purpose.

14 (e) For purposes of this section, unless a different
15 meaning is required:

16 "COVID-19" means the coronavirus disease 2019 and any of
17 its variants.

18 "COVID-19 vaccination card" means a card provided to a
19 person by a vaccine provider indicating the date the person
20 received a vaccination against COVID-19 and the type of vaccine
21 and its lot or batch number, and bearing a government logo or

1 other indication that it was created by a governmental
2 instrumentality.

3 "COVID-19 vaccination status" means whether a person has
4 received one or more doses of a COVID-19 vaccine, including but
5 not limited to the timing and type of any COVID-19 vaccine
6 received, or the person's medical condition or religious beliefs
7 as the basis for a COVID-19 vaccine exemption."


8 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
9 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
10 begun before its effective date.

11 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

COVID-19; Vaccination; Misrepresentation; Falsified or Altered Vaccination Card; Fines; Department of the Attorney General

Description:

Makes it a civil violation for a person to: (1) misrepresent to a business, church, nonprofit organization, or governmental entity the person's COVID-19 vaccination status, including the person's medical condition or religious beliefs as the basis for a COVID-19 vaccine exemption; (2) falsify or alter a COVID-19 vaccination card, or purchase a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card, for personal use; (3) use a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card; or (4) sell, distribute, or manufacture, regardless of whether the person is compensated, a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card for use by others. Establishes fines.
