
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COVID-19 VACCINATION STATUS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) It shall be a civil violation for any
2 person to intentionally, knowingly, or negligently:
- 3 (1) Misrepresent the person's COVID-19 vaccination status
4 to a business, church, nonprofit organization, or
5 governmental entity;
- 6 (2) Falsify, alter, or purchase a falsified or altered:
7 (A) COVID-19 vaccination card for personal use; or
8 (B) Printed document that details COVID-19
9 vaccination status for personal use; or
- 10 (3) Use a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card.
- 11 (b) Any person who violates subsection (a) shall be fined
12 \$1,000 for each separate violation.
- 13 (c) It shall be a civil violation for any person to:
- 14 (1) Sell; or
- 15 (2) Distribute or manufacture, regardless of whether that
16 person is compensated for the distribution or
17 manufacture,



1 a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card for use by
2 others.

3 (d) Any person who violates subsection (c) shall be fined
4 \$2,500 for each separate violation.

5 (e) The department of the attorney general shall enforce
6 this Act and may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii
7 Revised Statutes, to carry out its purpose.

8 (f) For purposes of this Act, unless a different meaning
9 is required:

10 "COVID-19" means the coronavirus disease 2019 and any of
11 its variants.

12 "COVID-19 vaccination card" means a card provided to a
13 person by a vaccine provider indicating the date the person
14 received a vaccination against COVID-19 and the type of vaccine
15 and its lot or batch number, and bearing a government logo or
16 other indication that it was created by a governmental
17 instrumentality.

18 "COVID-19 vaccination status" means whether a person has
19 received one or more doses of a COVID-19 vaccine, including but
20 not limited to the timing and type of any COVID-19 vaccine



1 received, or the person's medical condition or religious beliefs
2 as the basis for a COVID-19 vaccine exemption.

3 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
5 begun before its effective date.

6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050, and
7 shall be repealed be June 30, 2023.

Description:

Makes it a civil violation for a person to: (1) misrepresent to a business, church, nonprofit organization, or governmental entity the person's COVID-19 vaccination status, including the person's medical condition or religious beliefs as the basis for a COVID-19 vaccine exemption; (2) falsify or alter a COVID-19 vaccination card, or purchase a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card, for personal use; (3) use a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card; or (4) sell, distribute, or manufacture, regardless of whether the person is compensated, a falsified or altered COVID-19 vaccination card for use by others. Establishes fines. Effective 7/1/2050. Repeals on 6/30/2023. (HD1)
