### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the security and
resilience of Hawaii's critical electrical infrastructure are
fundamental to the health and welfare of the State and its
residents. Recent weather events highlight the importance of a
resilient electrical grid and the importance of restoring
electricity in a safe and efficient manner.

7 The legislature further finds that the construction and 8 maintenance of overhead and underground high voltage power lines 9 with distribution and transmission voltages require the 10 specialized skills of electrical workers, such as journeymen 11 linemen, foremen, and general foreman, who are all trained 12 certified journeyman lineman. To address a need for individuals 13 qualified to work with high voltage power lines, the legislature 14 enacted Act 65, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013 (Act 65). Act 65 15 provided a limited exemption from electrician licensing 16 requirements for individuals employed by electrical contractors 17 who are retained by a public utility within the State to perform



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1 high voltage work for the public utility and who are deemed 2 qualified by the public utility. Act 60, Session Laws of Hawaii 3 2018 (Act 60) extended the exemption for five more years and required the board of electricians and plumbers to submit 4 5 reports to the legislature related to high voltage work. The 6 legislature notes that Act 65 is scheduled to sunset on June 30, 7 2023. As the State continues to experience a shortage of 8 electricians, splicers, and lineman who are experienced and 9 qualified to work with high voltage, it is necessary to further 10 extend the sunset date of Act 65 and the associated reporting 11 requirements of Act 60.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to extend the sunset date of Act 65 and reporting requirements of Act 60 for an additional ten years.

15 SECTION 2. Act 65, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, as amended 16 by section 2 of Act 60, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, is amended 17 by amending section 4 to read as follows:

18 "SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 19 provided that on June 30, [2023,] 2033, this Act shall be 20 repealed and section 448E-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be



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1 reenacted in the form in which it read on the day before the 2 effective date of this Act." SECTION 3. Act 60, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, is amended 3 4 by amending section 3 to read as follows: 5 "SECTION 3. The board of electricians and plumbers shall 6 submit reports to the legislature no later than twenty days 7 prior to the convening of the regular [sessions] session of [2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023.] 2019 and each regular 8 9 session thereafter through 2033. The reports shall include but 10 not be limited to the following: 11 (1)Any programs in the State that offer vocational 12 training for licensed electricians to perform high 13 voltage electrical work; 14 (2) Availability of continuing education, training, or 15 both, necessary for licensed electricians to acquire 16 or keep current those skills related to performing 17 high voltage work; 18 (3) The number of licensed electricians in the State 19 qualified to perform high voltage electrical work; and 20 (4) Opportunities for growth in the high voltage work 21 subspecialty."



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
SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

### Report Title:

Electrical Contractors; Licensing; Exemptions; High Voltage

#### Description:

Extends until 2033 the sunset date of Act 65, SLH 2013, which provides a limited exemption to the licensing requirements for certain individuals in situations when an electric utility must retain qualified individuals to work with high voltage (600 volts or higher) who are not licensed in the State but are otherwise deemed qualified by the electric utility. Extends until 2033 the reporting requirements under Act 60, SLH 2018, regarding high voltage electrical contractors.
