
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) There shall be established within the
- 2 department of the attorney general for administrative purposes
- 3 the 2022 illegal fireworks task force. The task force shall use
- 4 the findings from the legislative reference bureau's 2019
- 5 report, "Blast from the Past: An Update to the Report of the
- 6 Illegal Fireworks Task Force to the Legislature for the Regular
- 7 Session of 2011", as the basis for developing a comprehensive
- 8 strategic plan to stop the importation of illegal fireworks and
- 9 explosives into Hawaii; promote compliance with the state
- 10 fireworks control law; and ensure the safety and security of the
- 11 airports, harbors, and other facilities and institutions in the
- 12 State against the discharge of illegal fireworks and explosives.
- 13 (b) The attorney general or attorney general's designee
- 14 shall be the chair of the task force.
- 15 (c) The following individuals or their designees shall
- 16 serve as members of the task force:
- 17 (1) Adjutant general;

- 2 (e) The chair shall also invite the following individuals
- 3 to serve as members of the task force:
- 4 (1) Two representatives of the shipping and trucking
- 5 industry; and
- 6 (2) Two representatives of the fireworks industry.
- 7 (f) The task force shall submit a report of its
- 8 comprehensive strategic plan, including findings,
- 9 recommendations, and any proposed legislation, to the
- 10 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 11 the regular session of 2023.
- 12 (g) The task force shall be dissolved on June 30, 2023.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

2022 Illegal Fireworks Task Force; Attorney General; Fireworks

Description:

Establishes the 2022 illegal fireworks task force within the department of the attorney general to develop a comprehensive strategic plan to stop the importation of illegal fireworks and explosives into the State, promote compliance with the fireworks control law; and ensure the safety and security of airports, harbors, and other facilities and institutions in the State against the discharge of illegal fireworks and explosives. Requires a report to the legislature.
