A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

20	(d)	Members of the task force shall serve without

21 compensation but shall be reimbursed for their actual and

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1 necessary expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in 2 carrying out their official duties pursuant to this Act. 3 (e) The task force shall submit a preliminary report of 4 its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 5 6 to the convening of the regular session of 2023. The task force 7 shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations, 8 including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later 9 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session 10 of 2024.

(f) The task force shall cease to exist on July 1, 2024.
SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Establishes the Rural Health Task Force within the Center for Nursing to prepare and develop solutions and make recommendations on registered nurse recruitment and retention in rural areas of Maui, Molokai, and Lanai. Requires the Rural Health Task Force to submit reports of its findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation to the Legislature prior to the Regular Session of 2023, and prior to the Regular Session of 2024.
