A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a nurse
shortage in the State that has been exacerbated by the
coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic. According to the department
of commerce and consumer affairs, almost five thousand nurses
left the field between 2019 and mid-year 2021, shrinking the
total active workforce from 33,410 in 2019 to 28,548 in 2021.

7 The legislature further finds that experienced, highly 8 qualified nurses from other states, territories, or foreign 9 countries may wish to relocate to Hawaii. Certain qualified 10 applicants for licensure by endorsement who are licensed in 11 another state are eligible for a temporary permit to practice in 12 the State while their applications are verified and reviewed. 13 Expanding the eligibility for a temporary permit to certain 14 registered nurses and qualified licensed practical nurses from 15 other territories and foreign jurisdictions will enable more 16 qualified health care professionals to quickly find employment 17 and enter into the State's health care field.

15	(4)	The practice of any legally qualified nurse of another
16		state who is employed by the United States or any

18		discharge of the nurse's official duties;
19	(5)	The practice of nursing in connection with healing by
20		prayer or spiritual means alone in accordance with the
21		tenets and practice of any well recognized church or



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1 religious denomination, provided that no person 2 practicing such nursing claims to practice as a 3 registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse; or (6) The administration of oral and topical medication and 4 5 in emergency situations, other premeasured medication, 6 by school health aides as provided in section [321-7 242.] 302A-853." SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 8 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 10 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
