A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGAL SERVICES FOR LOW-INCOME IMMIGRANTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are many
- 2 immigrants, and non-citizen residents from nations that have
- 3 signed compacts of free association with the United States, in
- 4 immigration-related proceedings who seek to continue legal
- 5 residence or obtain legal status in the country. However, the
- 6 immigration court process is highly complex, which may be
- 7 intimidating or overwhelming for immigrants and non-citizens who
- 8 may struggle with navigating a different culture and language.
- 9 Many immigrants and non-citizens may lack the resources to
- 10 obtain legal representation, which may have a profound impact on
- 11 the person's ability to receive a fair hearing.
- 12 To accurately effectuate the intent of this Act, as used
- 13 hereafter, the term "immigrant" shall include non-citizen
- 14 residents from nations that have signed compacts of free
- 15 association with the United States.
- 16 The legislature further finds that Hawaii has always
- 17 embraced a welcoming attitude for people of all backgrounds,



- 1 nationalities, and ethnicities. According to the 2017 American
- 2 Immigration Council Fact Sheet, nearly eighteen per cent of
- 3 Hawaii residents are immigrants, while more than one in seven
- 4 residents is a native-born United States citizen with at least
- 5 one immigrant parent. Immigrants are an integral part of
- 6 Hawaii's diverse, multicultural community and make extensive
- 7 contributions to the State.
- 8 Given the current political climate and the number of
- 9 immigrants being detained and faced with deportation, immigrants
- 10 in Hawaii are in dire need of legal help. Therefore, there are
- 11 vital public policy reasons behind providing legal assistance
- 12 and legal counsel to immigrants in immigration proceedings.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 14 funds to the judiciary to contract with nonprofit organizations
- 15 to provide legal counsel and assistance to low-income immigrants
- 16 in immigration related proceedings, including deportation
- 17 defense and asylum, and for any other immigration legal issues.
- 18 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 21 judiciary to contract with nonprofit organizations to provide

- 1 legal counsel and assistance to low-income immigrants in
- 2 immigrations related proceedings, including deportation defense
- 3 and asylum, and for any other immigration legal issues.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
- 5 the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2088.
