

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 187, Session
- 2 Laws of Hawaii 2012, established the Hawaii health corps program
- 3 as a means of addressing the State's longstanding health care
- 4 provider shortage. This program is aimed at increasing Hawaii
- 5 residents' ability to obtain timely medical services by
- 6 incentivizing family physicians, physician assistants, and nurse
- 7 practitioners to provide medical services in underserved and
- 8 rural areas in the State in return for repayment of loans.
- 9 The legislature further finds that because of the impact of
- 10 the "SARS-CoV-2" virus, there is an increased need across the
- 11 State for the services provided by social workers and
- 12 psychologists. However, under the current Hawaii health corps
- 13 program, social workers and psychologists are ineligible to
- 14 participate.
- The purpose of this Act is to:

1	(1)	Expand the Hawaii rural health care provider repayment
2		program to include eligible social workers and
3		psychologists;
4	(2)	Make the department of health responsible for
5		administration of the Hawaii rural health care
6		provider repayment program; and
7	(3)	Make an appropriation for the Hawaii rural health care
8		provider repayment program.
9	SECT	ION 2. Section 309H-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately	
11	inserted	and to read as follows:
12	""Ps	ychologist" means a person licensed as a psychologist
13	under cha	pter 465.
14	"Soc	ial worker" means a person licensed as a social worker
15	under cha	pter 467E."
16	SECT	ION 3. Section 309H-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended to read as follows:

13	(1)	Adopt rules and develop guidelines to administer the
14		program;
15	(2)	Identify and designate areas of the counties where
16		there is a shortage of physicians, physician
17		assistants, psychologists, social workers, and nurse
18		practitioners;
19	(3)	Establish criteria for the selection by the University
20		of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine of
21		physicians, physician assistants, psychologists, and

ı		nurse practitioners and by the university of Hawaii at
2		Manoa Thompson school of social work and public health
3		of social workers to participate in the Hawaii rural
4		health care provider loan repayment program;
5	(4)	Define and determine compliance with the service
6		commitments of the Hawaii rural health care provider
7		loan repayment program;
8	(5)	Collect and manage reimbursements from participants
9		who do not meet their service commitments under the
10		Hawaii rural health care provider loan repayment
11		program;
12	(6)	Publicize the program, particularly to maximize
13		participation by individuals who live in areas of a
14		county where there is a shortage of physicians,
15		physician assistants, psychologists, social workers,
16		and nurse practitioners;
17	(7)	Solicit and accept grants and donations from public
18		and private sources for the Hawaii rural health care
19		provider loan repayment program, including maximizing
20		the use of federal matching funds; and

1	(8) Establish criteria and procedures for calling Hawaii
2	health corps program participants into service during
3	an emergency or disaster."
4	SECTION 4. Section 309H-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	"[{]§309H-3[}] Hawaii rural health care provider loan
7	repayment program. (a) There is created within the Hawaii
8	health corps program, the Hawaii rural health care provider loan
9	repayment program to be administered by the [University of
10	Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine and the University of
11	Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing and dental hygiene] department
12	of health in partnership with a lending financial institution
13	whose operations are principally conducted in Hawaii. The
14	Hawaii rural health care provider loan repayment program shall
15	provide loan repayments to eligible physicians, physician
16	assistants, psychologists, social workers, and nurse
17	practitioners who make the service commitment under subsection
18	(b). The [University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine
19	and the University of Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing and
20	dental hygiene] department of health shall work with the
21	University of Mayaii John A. Burns asheel of modicine



- 1 University of Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing and dental
- 2 hygiene, and University of Hawaii at Manoa Thompson school of
- 3 social work and public health to identify loan payment amounts
- 4 and loan repayment program recipients. The department of health
- 5 shall make loan repayments directly to the financial institution
- 6 under subsection (b) to offset the loan repayment for which the
- 7 Hawaii rural health care provider loan repayment program
- 8 recipient would otherwise be liable. Loan repayments shall
- 9 commence upon the commencement of loan repayments by the Hawaii
- 10 rural health care provider loan repayment program recipient to
- 11 the lending financial institution. The [University of Hawaii
- 12 John A. Burns school of medicine and the University of Hawaii at
- 13 Manoa school of nursing and dental hygiene] department of health
- 14 shall prioritize loan repayments in accordance with the greatest
- 15 specialty shortages for the particular county.
- 16 (b) The Hawaii rural health care provider loan repayment
- 17 program shall provide loan repayments on behalf of licensed
- 18 physicians, physician assistants, psychologists, social workers,
- 19 and nurse practitioners who agree to serve for five consecutive
- 20 years as a physician, physician assistant, psychologist, social
- 21 worker, or nurse practitioner in a county having a shortage of



- 1 physicians, physician assistants, psychologists, social workers,
- 2 and nurse practitioners, with priority given to a rural area of
- 3 that particular county; provided that eligible physicians,
- 4 physician assistants, psychologists, social workers, or nurse
- 5 practitioners[ras applicable r] shall have graduated from a duly
- 6 accredited medical school or nursing school within the United
- 7 States[+] or received a degree in social work from an accredited
- 8 university or college within the United States, as applicable;
- 9 provided further that preference shall be given to graduates of
- 10 the University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine [or
- 11 the], University of Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing and dental
- 12 hygiene, or University of Hawaii at Manoa Thompson school of
- 13 social work and public health, as applicable.
- 14 (c) Eligible participants in the Hawaii rural health care
- 15 provider loan [+] repayment[+] program shall be determined by the
- 16 University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine [and the],
- 17 University of Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing and dental
- 18 hygiene, and University of Hawaii at Manoa Thompson school of
- 19 social work and public health on a competitive basis and in
- 20 accordance with subsection (b).

1 (d) If a Hawaii rural health care provider loan repayment 2 program participant fails to satisfy the recipient's service commitment under subsection (b), the Hawaii rural health care 3 4 provider loan repayment program participant shall be liable for 5 the repayment of the outstanding balance of the loan to the 6 lending financial institution under subsection (b). 7 addition, the [University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine and the University of Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing 8 9 and dental hygiene] department of health may seek reimbursement 10 for any loan repayment made by the [University of Hawaii John A. 11 Burns school of medicine and the University of Hawaii at Manoa 12 school of nursing and dental hygiene] department of health on 13 behalf of the Hawaii rural health care provider loan repayment 14 program participant. 15 In accordance with chapter 103D, the [University of 16 Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine and the University of 17 Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing and dental hygiene] department 18 of health may enter into written contracts with collection 19 agencies to collect delinquent reimbursements of loan 20 repayments. All payments collected, exclusive of a collection agency's commissions, shall revert and be credited to the Hawaii 21

- 1 health corps fund. A collection agency that enters into a
- 2 written contract with the [University of Hawaii John A. Burns
- 3 school of medicine and the University of Hawaii at Manoa school
- 4 of nursing and dental hygiene] department of health to collect
- 5 delinquent reimbursements of loan repayments pursuant to this
- 6 section may collect a commission from the debtor in accordance
- 7 with the terms of, and up to the amounts authorized in, the
- 8 written contract."
- 9 SECTION 5. Section 309H-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "\$309H-4 Hawaii health corps first responder service
- 12 obligation. If an emergency or disaster proclaimed under
- 13 chapter 127A occurs, physicians, physician assistants,
- 14 psychologists, social workers, and nurse practitioners
- 15 participating in the Hawaii health corps program may be ordered
- 16 into service by the governor as first responders to serve in
- 17 areas of the State and in a capacity determined by the director
- 18 of health."
- 19 SECTION 6. Section 309H-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
