A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CESSPOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that failing cesspools
2	are contaminating the State's ground water, streams, and coastal
3	ecosystems. To address this, Act 125, Session Laws of Hawaii
4	2017, required all cesspools to be upgraded or converted to a
5	septic system or aerobic treatment unit system, or connected to
6	a sewerage system, by 2050 and directed the department of health
7	to develop a system to prioritize their upgrade, conversion, or
8	connection based on their impact on public health. The
9	department of health's December 2017 report to the legislature
10	identified four priority categories: priority level one for
11	areas where cesspools present a significant risk of human
12	impacts, drinking water impacts, or draining to sensitive
13	waters; priority level two for areas where cesspools present a
14	potential to impact drinking water; priority level three for
15	areas where cesspools present a potential impact on sensitive
16	state waters or coastal ecosystems; and priority level four,
17	which includes cesspools where impacts have not yet been

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- 1 assessed. Cesspools categorized under levels one, two, and
- 2 three include approximately forty-three thousand cesspools in
- 3 the State.
- 4 The legislature recognizes that the requirement to upgrade
- 5 or convert a cesspool imposes a financial burden on low- and
- 6 moderate-income families.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to assist low- and moderate-
- 8 income property owners, including lessees on Hawaiian home
- 9 lands, with upgrading, converting, or connecting their failing
- 10 cesspools to more environmentally appropriate systems or
- 11 sewerage systems by creating a pilot grant project to assist
- 12 with conversion costs.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 342D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
- 15 designated and to read as follows:
- 16 "\$342D- Cesspool compliance pilot grant project. (a)
- 17 There is established in the department the cesspool compliance
- 18 pilot grant project to assist property owners, including lessees
- 19 on Hawaiian home lands, with upgrading, converting, or
- 20 connecting a cesspool that the department has identified as
- 21 failing. Specifically, the cesspool compliance pilot grant

9	real prop	erty with a cesspool or lessee on Hawaiian home lands
10	with a ce	sspool unless:
11	(1)	The department has assigned the cesspool to priority
12		level one, two, or three in the department's December
13		2017 report to the legislature entitled, "Relating to
14		Cesspools and Prioritization for Replacement"; and
15	(2)	The owner or lessee provides the department with the
16		tax return required by this section.
17	(c)	No grant under this section shall be awarded to any
18	owner of	real property with a cesspool or lessee on Hawaiian
19	home land	s with a cesspool who is:

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1	(1)	A taxpayer filing a single return or a married person
2		filing separately with a federal adjusted gross income
3		of \$ or more;
4	(2)	A taxpayer filing as a head of household with a
5		<pre>federal adjusted gross income of \$ or more;</pre>
6		<u>or</u>
7	(3)	A taxpayer filing a joint return or as a surviving
8		spouse with a federal adjusted gross income of
9		\$ or more.
10	The	owner's or lessee's income shall be verified using the
11	tax retur	on of the most recent taxable year that is closed.
12	(d)	The department shall grant awards on a first-come,
13	first-ser	ved basis, subject to funding availability.
14	<u>(e)</u>	The department shall adopt rules as necessary to carry
15	out the c	esspool compliance pilot grant project; provided that
16	the rules	s shall include a method of calculating a sliding scale
17	grant amo	ount based upon the federal adjusted gross income of the
18	owner or	lessee of the property with a failing cesspool."
19	SECT	TION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
21	much ther	eeof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to

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1	implement	the cesspool compliance pilot grant project; provided
2	that \$	of the appropriation may be used to:
3	(1)	Fund one temporary, part-time position in the
4		department of health for a cesspool compliance pilot
5		grant project administrator to establish and
6		administer the project; or
7	(2)	Contract for services to establish and administer the
8		project.
9	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
10	health fo	r the purposes of this Act.

Cesspool Compliance Pilot Grant Project; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes a cesspool compliance pilot grant project to assist low- and moderate-income property owners, including lessees on Hawaiian home lands, with the costs of upgrading, converting, or connecting a cesspool. Applies to cesspools identified as failing by the Department of Health. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2100. (HD1)

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
