
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD SUPPORT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The department of the attorney general and
2 the department of human services shall jointly convene a study
3 group to examine:

4 (1) The impacts and impediments, including any conflicts
5 with federal law, of allowing child support payments
6 to pass through to temporary assistance for needy
7 families program recipients;

8 (2) Whether the pass through of child support payments to
9 temporary assistance for needy families program
10 recipients is permissible; and

11 (3) The costs to agencies of establishing a pass through
12 program for child support payments to temporary
13 assistance for needy families program recipients.

14 (b) The department of the attorney general and department
15 of human service shall invite community stakeholders to be
16 involved and participate in the study group.




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1 (c) The department of the attorney general and the
2 department of human services shall submit a report of its
3 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
4 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
5 to the convening of the regular session of 2023.

6 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
