
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE FOOD SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a sustainable food
2 system is one in which producers, retailers, members of the
3 community, non-governmental organizations, and government
4 agencies partner to create a vibrant and resilient local food
5 economy that enhances and sustains the environmental, economic,
6 and social health of the community.

7 The legislature further finds that developing a more
8 sustainable food system for Hawaii represents an opportunity to
9 create a new food economy that integrates the objectives of
10 "green" job creation, sustainable economic development, land
11 stewardship, food security, environmental protection, and
12 climate change resiliency with community health and well-being.

13 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish within
14 the office of planning and sustainable development the
15 sustainable food systems working group.

16 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the office of
17 planning and sustainable development the sustainable food



1 systems working group. The working group shall develop a plan
2 for a more sustainable, resilient local food economy that
3 enhances and sustains the environmental, economic, and social
4 health of the community.

5 (b) The sustainable food systems working group shall be
6 composed of the following members:

7 (1) One member of the house of representatives, to be
8 selected by the speaker of the house of
9 representatives;

10 (2) One member of the senate, to be selected by the
11 president of the senate;

12 (3) A representative of the Hawaii tourism authority, to
13 be selected by the president and chief executive
14 officer of the Hawaii tourism authority;

15 (4) Two representatives of the University of Hawaii system
16 who have experience in food systems, to be selected by
17 the director of the office of planning and sustainable
18 development;

19 (5) A representative of the department of agriculture, to
20 be selected by the chairperson of the board of
21 agriculture;



- 1 (6) A representative of the office of climate change,
2 sustainability and resiliency of the city and county
3 of Honolulu, to be selected by the chief resilience
4 officer and executive director of the office of
5 climate change, sustainability and resiliency of the
6 city and county of Honolulu;
- 7 (7) A representative of the department of native Hawaiian
8 health of the John A. Burns school of medicine of the
9 University of Hawaii, to be selected by the chair of
10 the department of native Hawaiian health;
- 11 (8) Two members of the native Hawaiian community, to be
12 selected by the director of the office of planning and
13 sustainable development; provided that one of the
14 members shall be a resident of a county other than the
15 city and county of Honolulu;
- 16 (9) A representative of the Hawaii Farm Bureau, to be
17 selected by the executive director of the Hawaii Farm
18 Bureau;
- 19 (10) A representative of the Hawaii Foodbank, to be
20 selected by the president and chief executive officer
21 of the Hawaii Foodbank;



- 1 (11) A representative of the agricultural sector, to be
2 selected by the director of the office of planning and
3 sustainable development;
- 4 (12) Four representatives of the agricultural sector, of
5 which each member shall represent one of the counties
6 of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, or the city and county of
7 Honolulu, to be selected by the respective mayor of
8 each county;
- 9 (13) A representative of the farm-to-school community in
10 Hawaii, to be selected by the director of the office
11 of planning and sustainable development;
- 12 (14) A representative of the Hawaii Foodservice Alliance,
13 to be selected by the owner of the Hawaii Foodservice
14 Alliance; and
- 15 (15) A representative of the Hawaii Food Industry
16 Association, to be selected by the executive director
17 of the Hawaii Food Industry Association.
- 18 (c) The director of the office of planning and sustainable
19 development shall serve as chair of the sustainable food systems
20 working group.



1 (d) The sustainable food systems working group shall
2 submit its plan and any recommendations for implementation of
3 the plan, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature
4 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
5 session of 2024.

6 (e) The office of planning and sustainable development
7 shall provide any necessary staff support, including for the
8 preparation of the plan identified in subsection (a), to the
9 sustainable food systems working group.

10 (f) The sustainable food systems working group shall be
11 dissolved on December 31, 2023.

12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000 or so much
14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
15 purpose of establishing the sustainable food systems working
16 group and implementing section 2 of this Act, including
17 coordinating stakeholder meetings; managing public meetings and
18 website data management in accordance with chapter 92, Hawaii
19 Revised Statutes; writing and printing the plan; and potentially
20 obtaining services on a fee.



1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
2 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
3 Act.

4 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$60,000 or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for one
7 full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) sustainability specialist
8 position for the office of planning and sustainable development,
9 statewide sustainability branch.

10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
11 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
12 Act.

13 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.

Description:

Establishes the sustainable food systems working group within the office of planning and sustainable development. Requires the working group to submit a plan, any recommendations for implementing the plan, and any proposed legislation to the legislature. Appropriates funds to establish the working group and develop the plan and for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) sustainability specialist to be employed by the office of planning and sustainable development statewide sustainability branch.
