A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OHANA ZONES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Act 209, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018,
- 2 section 4, as amended by section 1 of Act 128, Session Laws of
- 3 Hawaii 2019, is amended as follows:
- 4 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- 5 "(a) Contracts entered into by the agencies designated by
- 6 the governor pursuant to the ohana zones pilot program shall be
- 7 exempt from the requirements of chapters [103D and] 6E; 46,
- 8 excluding sections 46-1.5(5)(B), 46-88(c)(5), and 46-88(j); 92;
- 9 103F[$\frac{1}{7}$]; 205; 205A; 206E; 343; and sections 37-41, 37-74(d)(1),
- 10 40-66, 102-2, 103-2, 103-53, 103-55, 105-1 through 105-10, and
- 11 464-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes [-]; provided that no contract
- 12 entered into pursuant to the ohana zones pilot program or
- 13 structures constructed thereunder shall be exempt from county,
- 14 state, or federal flood plain management development standards,
- 15 or statutes, codes, ordinances, rules, or regulations with which
- 16 compliance is required under the National Flood Insurance
- 17 Program."



- 1 2. By amending subsection (f) to read:
- 2 "(f) The pilot program shall cease to exist on June 30,
- 3 [2023.] 2026."
- 4 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a five-year homeless
- 5 triage center pilot program to be administered by the department
- 6 of human services. The purpose of a homeless triage center
- 7 shall be to serve as a crisis assessment and management center
- 8 that provides temporary shelter and referral services for
- 9 homeless individuals with serious mental illness, chronic
- 10 medical conditions, or chronic substance abuse; provided that a
- 11 homeless triage center shall supplement, rather than supplant,
- 12 existing services. The pilot program shall assist homeless
- 13 adults to access appropriate treatment, shelter, care, and
- 14 housing.
- 15 (b) The homeless triage center pilot program shall cease
- 16 to exist on June 30, 2027.
- 17 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
- 20 the ohana zones pilot program established pursuant to Act 209,
- 21 Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, as amended by Act 128, Session Laws

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- 1 of Hawaii 2019, including expenses relating to staffing,
- 2 facility construction, provision of services, and administrative
- 3 costs.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the
- 5 governor for the purposes of this Act; provided that the
- 6 governor shall transfer the expenditure authority to designated
- 7 executive branch departments or agencies within a reasonable
- 8 time.
- 9 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the governor
- 10 may transfer all or a portion of the appropriation in this
- 11 section to the governor's designated executive branch agencies
- 12 for expenditures incurred in implementing the ohana zones pilot
- 13 program.
- 14 The governor's designated executive branch agencies may
- 15 expend any appropriation transferred pursuant to this section
- 16 for the performance of its duties under the ohana zones pilot
- 17 program.
- 18 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,500,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the

- 1 establishment, implementation, and administration of the
- 2 homeless triage center pilot program established under this Act.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 human services for the purposes of this Act and may be used for
- 5 necessary administrative and other costs of implementation,
- 6 including funding for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) planner
- 7 or specialist position.
- 8 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Ohana Zones Pilot Program; Exemptions; Extension; Appropriation

Description:

Expands the statutory exemptions granted to the Ohana Zones Pilot Program contracts. Extends the sunset date for the Ohana Zones Pilot Program for three years to June 30, 2026. Establishes a five-year Homeless Triage Center Pilot Program administered by the Department of Human Services to operate a Homeless Triage Center that serves as a crisis assessment and management center. Appropriates funds for the Ohana Zones Pilot Program and the Homeless Triage Center Pilot Program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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
