### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RENTAL HOUSING REVOLVING FUND.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the development of
- 2 rental housing for households making between sixty-one and one
- 3 hundred per cent of the of area median income is not financially
- 4 feasible. Although funding is set aside each year for the
- 5 rental housing revolving fund, these funds are used as gap
- 6 financing in conjunction with federal and state low-income
- 7 housing tax credit financed projects serving sixty per cent of
- 8 area median income and below.
- 9 The legislature further finds that although the rental
- 10 housing revolving fund allows funding up to one-hundred and
- 11 forty per cent of area median income, it rarely gets used for
- 12 families above sixty per cent of area median income, as the
- 13 demand for the funds in the revolving fund far exceed available
- 14 funding. Although general excise tax waivers and county
- 15 subsidies help reduce development costs, new workforce rental
- 16 housing is very difficult to build without state subsidies.

| 1  | The legislature also finds that strategies are needed to         |
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| 2  | keep local residents in the State. Having affordable rental      |
| 3  | housing opportunities for working families will reduce domestic  |
| 4  | outmigration and fill critical labor needs throughout the State. |
| 5  | The purpose of this Act is to set aside a certain amount of      |
| 6  | funds in the rental housing revolving fund for housing projects  |
| 7  | and units that are targeted to families with incomes between     |
| 8  | sixty-one and one hundred per cent of median family income.      |
| 9  | SECTION 2. Section 201H-202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is         |
| 10 | amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:           |
| 11 | "(e) Moneys available in the fund shall be used for the          |
| 12 | purpose of providing, in whole or in part, loans or grants for   |
| 13 | rental housing projects in the following order of priority:      |
| 14 | (1) Projects or units in projects that are allocated             |
| 15 | low-income housing credits pursuant to the state                 |
| 16 | housing credit ceiling under section 42(h) of the                |
| 17 | Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or projects           |
| 18 | or units in projects that are funded by programs of              |
| 19 | the United States Department of Housing and Urban                |
| 20 | Development and United States Department of                      |
| 21 | Agriculture Rural Development wherein:                           |

| 21 |     | hundred per cent of the median family income."         |

#### Report Title:

Rental Housing Revolving Fund; Affordable Housing

#### Description:

Requires a certain amount of funds in the rental housing revolving fund be used to provide loans or grants to mixed-income rental projects or units for persons and families with incomes between sixty-one and one hundred per cent of the median family income.

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
