## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISABLED VETERANS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds a debt of gratitude is
 owed to those who incur injuries while serving as members of the
 nation's armed forces, especially if those injuries result in
 life-long disabilities.

5 The legislature also finds that taking care of veterans is 6 critical to the future defense of our nation and should be 7 considered an investment. If the nation's armed forces are to 8 remain an all-volunteer force in the future, the nation must 9 begin taking greater care of its veterans now.

10 The legislature further finds that while the State can
11 never fully repay veterans for their service, the State can
12 offer certain exemptions to disabled veterans as a means of
13 showing gratitude. Despite disabled veterans receiving an
14 exemption from annual vehicle registrations fees, these veterans
15 are still require to pay the annual weight tax.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to extend theexempt disabled veterans from the annual vehicle weight tax.

1	SECTION 2. Section 249-31.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§249-31.5 Exemptions from registration fees and annual
4	weight tax for certain vehicles; disabled veterans. (a) A
5	disabled veteran who:
6	(1) Is a resident of Hawaii;
7	(2) Has been other than dishonorably discharged from the
8	United States uniformed armed forces; and
9	(3) Is determined by the United States Department of
10	Veterans Affairs or its predecessor to have a service
11	connected one hundred per cent disability rating for
12	compensation or a service-connected disability rating
13	of one hundred per cent,
14	shall be exempt from payment of all annual vehicle registration
15	fees and annual vehicle weight tax as required by [ <del>section</del> ]
16	sections 249-31[+] and 249-33, respectively; provided that this
17	exemption shall not extend to any vehicle used for commercial
18	purposes or to more than one vehicle owned by the disabled
19	veteran.
20	(b) The director of the office of veterans' services, in

1 services, shall submit a report to the legislature and the 2 department of taxation no later than twenty days prior to the 3 convening of each regular session providing the legislature and 4 the department of taxation with the total number of disabled 5 veterans who qualify under this section for the exemption from 6 annual vehicle registration fees."

7 SECTION 3. Section 249-33, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

"(c) The exemptions provided by sections 249-3 to 249-6 9 and 249-31.5 shall apply to this section. The provisions for 10 11 refunds, and taxes for fraction of years for vehicles removed 12 from or brought into the State and for junked vehicles, 13 contained in sections 249-3 and 249-5 shall apply to the tax 14 levied by this section."

15 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.
