A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACCESS FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH PRINT DISABILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the public utilities
- 2 commission has a duty and obligation to obtain and maintain
- 3 access to a basic set of essential telecommunications services
- 4 for individuals who are blind or visually impaired.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to require the public utilities
- 6 commission to provide free telecommunications access to
- 7 information for persons with print disabilities through use of
- 8 the universal service fund established pursuant to section
- 9 269-41, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
- 12 designated and to read as follows:
- 13 "§269- Universal service program; access for individuals
- 14 with print disabilities. (a) The public utilities commission
- 15 shall use funds from the universal service fund established
- 16 pursuant to section 269-42 to provide free telephonic access to

- 1 time-sensitive information, including but not limited to state
- 2 and local government information, public notices, emergency
- 3 alerts, job opportunities, daily newspapers, and other content,
- 4 to allow individuals who are blind or visually impaired to
- 5 access information and services. The telephonic access shall be
- 6 in formats accessible to and usable by persons with print
- 7 disabilities.
- 8 (b) The public utilities commission shall adopt rules to
- 9 implement this section."
- 10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
