## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING FEBRUARY 2022 AS SELF-CARE AWARENESS MONTH.

WHEREAS, self-care is the lifelong daily habit of healthy choices for overall wellness, including good hygiene practices, a healthy diet, regular exercise, and personal healthcare for prevention; diagnosis, treatment, and management of infections, injuries, and illness; and knowing when to seek assistance from healthcare professionals; and

8 WHEREAS, self-care is a cornerstone of helping to reduce 9 the overall cost of healthcare in Hawaii and the nation; and 10

WHEREAS, self-care includes making responsible use of overthe-counter and prescription medications, dietary supplements, and medical devices; and 14

15 WHEREAS, the United States Food and Drug Administration 16 deems over-the-counter medicine safe and effective for the self-17 care treatment of minor acute and chronic health conditions and 18 symptoms such as pain, the common cold, and allergies, which 19 affect large segments of the population; and

21 WHEREAS, according to a study by Information Resources, 22 Inc., every dollar spent on over-the-counter medicines saves 23 more than \$7 for the healthcare system, resulting in more than 24 \$146,000,000,000 in annual savings; and

26 WHEREAS, over-the-counter medical devices like bandages, 27 menstrual products, face masks, and at-home test kits, used for 28 the purposes of prevention, testing, and treatment, are well-29 accepted, cost-saving elements of the healthcare system; and 30

WHEREAS, the consumption of vitamin and mineral supplements 1 2 can fill critical nutrient gaps, particularly for lower-income families that may experience food insecurity in Hawaii; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii benefits when its residents practice 5 6 appropriate self-care; do not make unnecessary visits to healthcare professionals, thereby reducing the burden on the 7 8 healthcare system; and are empowered by higher self-esteem, 9 improved health, and overall wellness; and 10 WHEREAS, the availability of self-care can help improve 11 personal and public health, save personal and public financial 12 resources, and strengthen the sustainability of the broader 13 14 healthcare system; and 15 16 WHEREAS, exemptions for over-the-counter medicines, dietary supplements, and consumer medical devices from the general 17 excise tax benefit Hawaii residents because when consumer 18 healthcare products become more affordable, greater numbers of 19 individuals will use these products to treat their ailments 20 before these ailments grow in severity; now, therefore, 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 24 of 2022, the Senate concurring, that this body encourages 25 consumers, healthcare practitioners, policymakers, and 26 regulators to understand and communicate the benefits of self-27 care by recognizing February 2022 as Self-Care Awareness Month; 28 29 and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director 32 33 of Health, and President and Chief Executive Officer of the Healthcare Association of Hawaii. 34 35 36 37 OFFERED BY:
