HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS TO CONDUCT AN ANALYSIS REGARDING THE SCOPES OF PRACTICE FOR ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES AND PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS.

WHEREAS, this body recognizes that there is a physician 1 2 shortage in the State, which often presents a challenge for 3 rural communities to access health care; and 4 WHEREAS, advanced practice registered nurses and physician 5 6 assistants are vital health care professionals who are capable of filling in some of the gaps in access to health care in the 7 State; and 8 9 WHEREAS, various measures have been introduced during the 10 11 Regular Session of 2022 and past regular sessions that have proposed expanding the scopes of practice for advanced practice 12 13 registered nurses and physician assistants; and 14 WHEREAS, there is a need to clearly distinguish the scopes 15 of practice of advanced practice registered nurses and physician 16 assistants and determine the appropriate scope of practice for 17 each of these professions in Hawaii to better complement the 18 work of physicians; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 22 23 of 2022, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs is requested to conduct an analysis 24 regarding the scopes of practice for advanced practice 25 registered nurses and physician assistants; and 26 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and 29 Consumer Affairs is requested to analyze whether the scopes of



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practice for advanced practice registered nurses and physician 1 2 assistants should be expanded in certain areas of medical care and services, including: 3 4 5 (1)School-based health services; 6 7 (2) Medical care for minors related to human 8 immunodeficiency virus; 9 (3) Abortion care; 10 11 12 (4) The records review process for prescriptions of controlled substances; 13 14 15 (5) Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments waived tests; and 16 17 Medical aid in dying; and 18 (6) 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs may include in its analysis a comparison to 21 other jurisdictions and whether those jurisdictions allow for 22 similar expanded scopes of practice; and 23 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs is requested to submit a report of its findings 26 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 27 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 28 the Regular Session of 2023; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 31 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce 32 and Consumer Affairs, Chairperson of the Hawaii Medical Board, 33 34 and Chairperson of the State Board of Nursing. 35 36 37



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
