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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ADOPTION OF A STATE POLICY ASSURING THAT SAVINGS REALIZED BY THE STATE THROUGH THE EXTENSION OF FEDERAL MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PERCENTAGE PAYMENTS OF ONE HUNDRED PERCENT FOR NATIVE HAWAIIAN HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS IS USED TO ADDRESS HEALTH DISPARITIES EXPERIENCED BY NATIVE HAWAIIAN COMMUNITIES.

WHEREAS, Papa Ola Lōkahi is a Hawaii nonprofit corporation, 1 501(c)(3) public charity, and consortium of public agencies and 2 private nonprofit organizations that are concerned with 3 improving Native Hawaiian cultural, physical, mental, and 4 5 spiritual health and well-being, including by entering into agreements or memoranda of understanding with relevant 6 organizations that are capable of providing resources or 7 services to the Native Hawaiian health care systems that serve 8 the unique health needs of Hawaiian communities; and 9 10

WHEREAS, AHARO Hawaii (AHARO) is a Hawaii nonprofit 11 12 corporation, 501(c)(3) public charity, and consortium of Hawaii nonprofit corporations, each of which is a 501(c)(3) public 13 charity and federally qualified community health center that has 14 demonstrated records of contributing to the health and well-15 being of Native Hawaiians and providing a wide range of 16 17 culturally-sensitive, holistic, and primary care health services to predominately rural, multi-generational Native Hawaiian 18 19 communities in medically underserved areas within the State; and 20

WHEREAS, AHARO is currently comprised of five federally qualified health center organizations: Bay Clinic, Inc.; Hamakua Health Center, Inc.; Molokai Ohana Health Care, Inc. (dba Molokai Community Health Center); Waianae District Comprehensive Health and Hospital Board, Inc. (dba Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center); and Waimanalo Health Center; and



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WHEREAS, AHARO member organizations integrate traditional 1 Native Hawaiian healing practices into their primary care 2 3 services; and 4 5 WHEREAS, each AHARO member organization has established a Kupuna Council of traditional Hawaiian healers recognized by 6 7 Papa Ola Lōkahi that distinguishes practitioners of Hawaiian 8 healing traditions from medical clinicians in Hawaii and provides for the protection and preservation of such healing 9 practices as assured by the Hawaii State Constitution; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, under section 9815 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), the federal government will pay one hundred 13 14 percent of the cost of Medicaid services provided at Native Hawaiian Health Centers for sixteen fiscal year quarters, which 15 may be extended; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Papa Ola Lōkahi and AHARO have agreed that AHARO 18 member health centers will serve as additional Native Hawaiian 19 Health Centers and are recognized as part of the federal effort 20 to address health disparities experienced by Native Hawaiians; 21 and 22 23 WHEREAS, the current limited QUEST dental program does not 24 address the needs in multi-generational Hawaiian communities 25 where extensive dental work is needed; and 26 27 WHEREAS, full adult dental services are a required service 28 29 of a federally qualified health center and are typically supported through a state match; and 30 31 WHEREAS, state savings, realized from the Native Hawaiian 32 33 Federal Medical Assistance Percentage recalculation, should be 34 used to address continuing health disparities of Native Hawaiians, which include dental disease and the early onset of 35 chronic diseases; and 36 37 WHEREAS, these supplemental health care services should be 38 39 provided by health care providers authorized by Papa Ola Lōkahi; now, therefore, 40 41



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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 1 2 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 3 of 2022, the Senate concurring, that all executive departments 4 are requested to adopt a state policy assuring that savings 5 realized by the State through the extension of Federal Medical Assistance Percentage payments of one hundred percent for Native 6 Hawaiian health care systems is used to address health 7 disparities experienced by Native Hawaiian communities; and 8 9

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all executive departments are 11 urged to review their policies and prioritize the goal of 12 adopting this state policy; and 13

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the members of Hawaii's 15 congressional delegation; Governor; Director of Health; Director 16 of Human Services; Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the 17 Office of Hawaiian Affairs; Executive Director of Papa Ola 18 19 Lōkahi; President of AHARO Hawaii; Chief Executive Officer of 20 the Bay Clinic, Inc.; Chief Executive Officer of the Hamakua Health Center, Inc.; Chief Executive Officer of the Molokai 21 Community Health Center; Chairperson of the Waianae Coast 22 23 Comprehensive Health Center; and Chief Executive Officer of the 24 Waimanalo Health Center.

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
