## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP A FERAL UNGULATE MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR WEST HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the populations of feral goats and pigs in west 2 Hawaii island have increased to sizes that cannot be sustained 3 by the environment; and 4 5 WHEREAS, feral ungulates in Hawaii have no natural 6 predators to limit their population growth and impact on native 7 ecosystems; and 8 9 WHEREAS, feral ungulates contribute to the spread of rapid 10 ohia death and can have deleterious effects on pasture forage and native forests; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the overpopulation of feral ungulates has a 14 significant detrimental impact on the health of watersheds and coral reefs through increased vegetative disturbance and 15 16 erosion; and 17 18 WHEREAS, grazing, browsing, trampling, and rooting by feral ungulates in West Hawaii have contributed to the destruction of 19 20 crops, resulting in considerable losses for the agricultural industry; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, feral ungulates damage landscape plants and structures within the built environment, causing significant 24 25 economic damage to businesses, resorts, parks, cultural sites, and residential areas; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, feral ungulates create major hazards on roadways 29 in West Hawaii, occasionally causing motor vehicle accidents; 30 and

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1 2 WHEREAS, considerable private and public resources are 3 being expended to address the overpopulation of feral ungulates, and more humane, effective, and beneficial solutions and best 4 management practices are needed; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the hunting of feral game mammals is an important 8 local food source and public recreational and subsistence 9 hunting opportunity; however, the populations of such animals 10 are not sufficiently controlled through hunting alone; and 11 12 WHEREAS, collaborative efforts are needed to identify opportunities for more effective management of feral ungulate 13 14 populations, such as higher bag limits and increased open 15 seasons for hunters, incentivization of commercially guided hunting operations, increased use of game mammals for meat and 16 17 food security, targeted culling in overpopulated areas, and 18 other methods; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 22 of 2022, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested to convene a task force to 23 24 develop a feral ungulate management plan for West Hawaii; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force consist of the following members: 27 28 29 (1) One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of 30 Representatives; 31 (2)32 One member appointed by the President of the Senate; 33 34 (3) One member appointed by the Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources; 35 36 37 (4) One member appointed by the Chairperson of the Board 38 of Agriculture; 39 (5) 40 One member appointed by the Director of 41 Transportation; 42

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 7 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 8 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 9 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 10 2024; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force will be 13 dissolved on June 30, 2024; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, 16 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, 17 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, Director of 18 Transportation, Mayor of the County of Hawaii, Chancellor of the 19 20 University of Hawaii at Hilo, Manager of the Big Island Invasive Species Committee, and Chairperson of the Hawaii County Game 21 22 Management Advisory Commission. 23
