

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO FOLLOW WORKFORCE HOUSING MODELS, SUCH AS KOA'E MAKANA AND THE HOKUAO 201H HOUSING PROJECT, FOR ALL TEACHERS SEEKING AFFORDABLE UNITS IN THE STATE.

1	WHEREAS, it is critical to lessen the financial burden many
2	teachers are experiencing in the State; and
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4	WHEREAS, according to a report by the Department of
5	Education, in the 2017-2018 school year, 51.8 percent of
6	teachers who resigned cited "leaving Hawaii" as their primary
7	reason for resigning, while fourteen percent resigned for a non-
8	teaching- or non-education-related job; and
9	TURDER C. the 2010 2010 set all means there were end
10	WHEREAS, for the 2018-2019 school year, there were one
11	thousand twenty-nine teacher vacancies throughout the State, up
12	from one thousand eleven during the 2017-2018 school year and nine hundred twenty during the 2016-2017 school year; and
13 14	hime hundred twenty during the 2010-2017 School year, and
14 15	WHEREAS, one way to improve the quality of education in
15 16	Hawaii is to fill all public school classrooms with full-time
17	teachers, rather than long-term substitutes; and

19	WHEREAS, recruiting and retaining qualified teachers is
20	essential to the future of education in Hawaii; and
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22	WHEREAS, providing financial incentives, such as affordable
23	housing for teachers, is a means for the Department of Education
24	and public charter schools to recruit and retain qualified
25	teachers; now, therefore,
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27	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
28	Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
29	of 2022, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Education

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is urged to follow workforce housing models, such as Koa'e Makana 1 and the Hokuao 201H Housing Project, for all teachers seeking 2 affordable units in the State; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 5 requested to consider forming community partnerships to ensure 6 housing security for full-time teachers by: 7 8 Supplying homes to meet the current and growing demand 9 (1)10 by teachers; 11 Strengthening the relationships between "place and 12 (2) people" by displaying solidarity for the role a 13 teacher plays in the lives of the community the 14 teacher serves; 15 16 Acknowledging the major teacher shortage that has 17 (3) impacted the State and, where appropriate, protecting 18 teachers through the current and future pandemics; 19 20 (4) Engaging in collaborative efforts that provide a 21 pathway to homeownership for teachers; and 22 23 Supporting Hawaii's teachers, families, and (5) 24 communities that contribute to Hawaii's economy; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 27 requested to collaborate with the Hawaii Housing Finance and 28 Development Corporation and Hawaii Community Development 29 Authority to address the deficit of affordable housing for 30 teachers; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 34 Board of Education, Superintendent of Education, Executive 35 Director of the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development 36 Corporation, and Executive Director of the Hawaii Community 37 Development Authority. 38 39 40 OFFERED BE Tigela A Clark MAR - 3 2022 41

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
