

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## REQUESTING PUBLIC UTILITIES TO PROVIDE A FIFTY PERCENT RATE DISCOUNT TO RETIRED SENIOR CITIZENS.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, many retired senior citizens live on fixed incomes and tight budgets, requiring them to limit expenses; and		
4 5 6 7 8	WHEREAS, the costs of public utilities, including electricity, water, gas, telephone, and telecommunication services are consistently rising and are difficult to limit or negotiate; and		
9	WHEREAS, the widening gaps between the rising costs of		
10	public utility services and fixed incomes of retired senior		
11	citizens make it increasingly difficult for retired senior		
12 13	citizens to live within their budgets; and		
13	WHEREAS, proactive measures are needed to help retired		
15	senior citizens maintain a reasonable quality of life despite		
16	rising, but necessary, public utility expenses; now, therefore,

18 19	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session		
20	of 2022, the Senate concurring, that any public utility having a		
21	certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by the		
22	Public Utilities Commission is requested to provide a fifty		
23	percent rate discount to any customer who is a retired senior		
24 25	citizen; and		
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Public Utilities Commission		
27	is requested to assess the actions taken by public utilities and		
28	to determine whether any additional legislation is needed to		
29	ensure that retired senior citizens receive fifty percent rate		
30 31	discounts; and		
31 32	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Public Utilities Commission		
33	is requested to submit a report of its findings and

recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
the Regular Session of 2023; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 6 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce 7 and Consumer Affairs and Chairperson of the Public Utilities 8 Commission, who, in turn, is requested to distribute copies of 9 this Concurrent Resolution to all public utilities that 10 currently hold a certificate of public convenience and necessity 11 issued by the Commission.
