

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT OF PROPOSED MANDATORY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, Hawaii has long been a leader in advancing reproductive rights and advocating for equitable and affordable access to sexual and reproductive health care; and
- 5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, federal protections for abortion, preventative care, contraceptives, and other sexual and reproductive health care services are consistently threatened, making state protections for these services especially critical; and
10 11 12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, other states have enacted laws that effectively eliminate abortion access in the states, reflecting a broad strategy to challenge and overturn the United States Supreme Court's holding in Roe v. Wade, which protects abortion access; and
16 17 18 19 20	WHEREAS, the Trump administration made it difficult for insurers to cover abortion care and assembled a Supreme Court that may restrict abortion access and strike down the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; and
21 22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, eliminating the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act would force many Hawaii residents to pay more out-of- pocket health care costs, leading many to delay or forego needed care; and
26 27 28 29 30	WHEREAS, access to sexual and reproductive health care, including no-cost preventive services, is critical for the health and economic security of all people in Hawaii and will help avoid more costly treatments in the future; and



## H.C.R. NO. 9

1 WHEREAS, House Bill No. 249, originally introduced during the Regular Session of 2021, would prohibit discrimination in 2 3 the provision of sexual and reproductive health care services and requires health insurers, mutual benefit societies, and 4 health maintenance organizations to provide coverage without 5 cost-sharing for a range of reproductive health services, drugs, 6 7 devices, products, and procedures; and 8 9 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires 10 that, before considering any legislative measure that mandates 11 health insurance coverage for specific health services, specific diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part 12 of individual or group health insurance policies, the 13 14 Legislature shall pass a concurrent resolution asking the Auditor to prepare and submit to the Legislature a report that 15 16 assesses the social and financial effects of the proposed mandatory coverage; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 20 of 2022, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to 21 22 conduct a social and financial assessment of House Bill No. 249, which was introduced during the Regular Session of 2021; and 23 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to submit a report of the Auditor's findings and recommendations, 26 27 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 28 of 2023; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 31 32 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor, Director of 33 Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and Insurance Commissioner. 34 35 Firede 36 OFFERED BY:
