
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP AND ADD FARM TO SCHOOL IMPLEMENTATION STANDARDS TO THE ANNUAL SCHOOL PRINCIPAL EVALUATIONS.

1 WHEREAS, school food programs play a critical role in
2 improving the health and educational outcomes of Hawaii's keiki
3 by encouraging consumption of fresh, locally grown foods; and
4

5 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Farm to School Program was established
6 in 2015 to transition the State's school food systems toward
7 locally grown food for the benefit of students, small
8 businesses, local farmers, and the environment; and
9

10 WHEREAS, from 2016 to 2018, the Aina Pono Executive Program
11 oversaw two pilot projects to evaluate the feasibility of and
12 processes required to increase the amount of fresh, local food
13 on public school menus; and
14

15 WHEREAS, the success of these pilot projects highlighted
16 the need to make similar changes across the public school
17 system; and
18

19 WHEREAS, the implementation of farm to school programs
20 requires centralized strategies across the Department of
21 Education and site-specific strategies at each school; and

23 WHEREAS, principals and school administration play a key
24 role in the implementation of farm to school programs; now,
25 therefore,

27 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
28 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
29 of 2022, that the Department of Education is requested to
30 develop farm to school implementation standards and to add the
31 standards to the annual school principal evaluations to improve


1 student access to fresh, local foods in public school food
