## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TAXATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE THE POTENTIAL NEW REVENUE FOR THE STATE RESULTING FROM A TAX ON ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES.

WHEREAS, in recent years, self-reported cigarette smoking 1 has declined among youth and adults, while e-cigarette use has 2 3 increased; and 4 5 WHEREAS, between November 2016 and August 2019, total e-6 cigarette sales in the United States increased nearly three 7 hundred percent; and 8 9 WHEREAS, because flavored e-cigarettes can be imported into the State, any state laws or regulations banning flavored e-10 cigarettes must be contingent on the passing of federal 11 12 legislation; and 13 14 WHEREAS, there appears to be a disparity between the tax 15 treatment of cigarettes, cigars, and other tobacco products versus e-cigarettes and other forms of electronic smoking 16 devices, resulting in an economic incentive to purchase e-17 cigarettes and other forms of electronic smoking devices; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, taxes on tobacco products have historically been used to raise revenues for the State; now, therefore, 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 24 of 2022, that the Department of Taxation is requested to conduct 25 a study to determine the potential new revenue for the State 26 resulting from a tax on electronic smoking devices; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Taxation is 29 requested to submit a report of its findings and 30 31 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
