HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO INCREASE ACCESS TO ARTS AND CULTURAL EDUCATION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO ADDRESS LEARNING LOSS CAUSED BY THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC.

WHEREAS, providing a well-rounded education to all public 1 2 school students advances the economic and social health of 3 Hawaii; and 4 5 WHEREAS, art, music, and cultural curricula constitute 6 important parts of a well-rounded education that address the 7 developmental needs of the whole child; and 8 9 WHEREAS, in 2013, researchers in the Department of 10 Education Reform at the University of Arkansas found that instruction in visual arts led to gains in critical-thinking 11 12 skills: and 13 14 WHEREAS, according to a 2014 study performed by Lois Hetland and Ellen Winner of the Harvard Graduate School of 15 16 Education, education in music and drama shows a generalizable causal relationship to increases in verbal achievement and 17 18 spatial reasoning; and 19 WHEREAS, Paul T. Sowden, a professor of psychology at the 20 University of Winchester in England, has noted that arts and 21 cultural education develop children's capacity for 22 collaboration, creativity, and intellectual inquiry; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, research performed by Mariale Hardiman, Director of the Neuro-Education Initiative at the Johns Hopkins School of 26 27 Education, has shown that students with access to arts and cultural content are more adept at retaining instruction 28 29 regardless of subject matter, demonstrating that arts and cultural instruction could help to mitigate learning loss; and 30 31

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WHEREAS, a study conducted by researchers at the University 1 of Missouri and University of Texas A&M found that a substantial 2 increase in access to arts education led to a 3.6 percentage 3 4 point reduction in disciplinary infractions, an improvement of 5 thirteen percent on standardized writing scores, and an increase 6 of eight percent in measures of compassion for others; and 7 8 WHEREAS, in an article published by the Brookings 9 Institution, the same researchers concluded that the arts 10 "challenge us with different points of view, compel us to empathize with others, and give us the opportunity to reflect on 11 12 the human condition"; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the researchers further found that "[a]mong adults, arts participation is related to behaviors that 15 contribute to the health of civil society, such as increased 16 17 civic engagement, greater social tolerance, and reductions in 18 other-regarding behavior"; and 19 20 WHEREAS, access to arts education has a positive impact on social and emotional learning and academic performance across 21 22 subject areas; and 23 24 WHEREAS, during the COVID-19 pandemic, Hawaii's public school students experienced "learning loss", with the Department 25 of Education reporting in 2021 that just thirty-two percent of 26 27 public school students were proficient in math, a twenty-six 28 percent drop from 2019; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the Department of Education also reported that 31 language arts proficiency dropped to fifty percent from fiftyfour percent and science proficiency dropped from forty-four 32 33 percent to thirty-five percent during the same time period; and 34 35 WHEREAS, the Department of Education received hundreds of millions of dollars in Elementary and Secondary School Emergency 36 37 Relief funds to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on school communities and student achievement; now, therefore, 38 39 40 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 41 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 42 of 2022, that the Department of Education is urged to increase

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1 access to arts and cultural education in public schools to
2 address learning loss caused by the COVID-19 pandemic; and
3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
