HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT AN AUDIT OF HARBOR INSPECTION PROCEDURES OF STATE DEPARTMENTS AND FEDERAL AGENCIES FOR SHIPPING CONTAINERS TO PREVENT THE IMPORTATION OF ILLEGAL FIREWORKS INTO THE STATE.

WHEREAS, in 2011, the City and County of Honolulu imposed a 1 2 partial fireworks ban on pyrotechnics use, making the possession 3 and use of aerial fireworks and certain other consumer fireworks illegal; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, despite the ban and in other areas of the State, 7 there continue to be numerous instances of illegal firework use, 8 which have caused physical injuries and property damage; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Act 170, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, established the Illegal Fireworks Task Force to develop strategies and make 11 12 recommendations to the Legislature to address the illegal importation and use of fireworks in the State; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Illegal Fireworks Task Force recommended in 15 16 its January 2011 report an increase in random inspections for illegal fireworks by expanding the inspection authority for 17 state departments and focusing cargo inspections to make the 18 19 inspections more manageable; and 20 WHEREAS, pursuant to Act 184, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, 21 22 the Legislative Reference Bureau updated the findings and 23 recommendations of the January 2011 report; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the 2019 Legislative Reference Bureau report, 26 Blast From the Past: An Update to the Report of the Illegal Fireworks Task Force to the Legislature for the Regular Session 27 of 2011, indicated that the "majority of respondents to the 28 [Legislative Reference] Bureau's Survey appeared to agree that 29 30 the issues and challenges presented by the Task Force in its 2011 report remain relevant today."; and 31

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1 2 WHEREAS, the state harbors system consists of ten commercial harbors, all of which are under the authority of the 3 4 State; and 5 6 WHEREAS, over ninety-nine percent of the more than two 7 hundred thousand shipping cargo containers that arrive in Hawaii each year come through the State's commercial harbors, and only 8 a small fraction of these shipping containers are inspected by 9 10 government agencies; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the lack of sufficient cargo inspections increases 13 the opportunity for illegal fireworks to enter the State; and 14 15 WHEREAS, an audit of current harbor inspection procedures 16 of state departments and federal agencies for out-of-state and 17 interisland arrivals of shipping containers would: 18 19 (1)Outline current inspection procedures at state 20 harbors; 21 22 (2)Identify any shortcomings in the current procedures; 23 24 (3) Determine whether the recommendations of the January 2011 Illegal Fireworks Task Force report and the 2019 25 26 Legislative Reference Bureau update to the Task 27 Force's report relating to harbor inspections have 28 been implemented and to what extent; and 29 30 (4)Determine any necessary changes that would reduce the 31 volume of illegal fireworks being imported into the 32 State; now, therefore, 33 34 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 35 of 2022, that the Auditor is requested to conduct an audit of 36 37 current harbor inspection procedures of state departments and 38 federal agencies for out-of-state and interisland arrivals of 39 shipping containers to prevent the importation of illegal fireworks into the State; and 40
