A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A SCHOOL SUPPLY SUBSIDY PILOT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Title I, Part A, of
- 2 the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the
- 3 Every Student Succeeds Act (Title I), provides federal financial
- 4 assistance to local educational agencies and schools with high
- 5 percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure
- 6 educational success. The legislature further finds that a pilot
- 7 program to subsidize school supplies for schools composed
- 8 entirely of students eligible for participation in Title I would
- 9 be useful to identify methods for relieving the financial burden
- 10 of education on low-income families.
- 11 As a school composed entirely of students eligible for
- 12 participation in Title I, the legislature identifies Naalehu
- 13 elementary school for a pilot program. The legislature further
- 14 finds that many students who attend Naalehu elementary school
- 15 live in rural areas across Kau and experience geographical
- 16 challenges, such as limited opportunities and isolation from
- 17 educational resources.



- 1 The legislature further finds that, based on the school
- 2 supplies list for the 2021-2022 school year at Naalehu
- 3 elementary school and the average cost of school supplies at
- 4 local stores, the cost for school supplies by grade are as
- 5 follows: grade one, \$4,451.58; grade two, \$1,605.86; grade
- 6 three, \$3,646.08; grade four, \$5,186.94; grade five, \$4,913.63;
- 7 and grade six, \$3,969.
- 8 The legislature further finds that, despite the current
- 9 economic situation, Hawaii's schools should focus resources to
- 10 retaining and developing those qualified teachers, support
- 11 staff, and administrators who collaborate to create and sustain
- 12 the successful learning environments necessary to graduate every
- 13 student.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to establish and make an
- 15 appropriation for a one-year school supply subsidy pilot program
- 16 at Naalehu elementary school.
- 17 SECTION 2. (a) Beginning with school year 2021-2022, the
- 18 department of education shall establish and implement a one-year
- 19 school supply subsidy pilot program at Naalehu elementary
- 20 school.

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- 1 (b) The department of education shall submit a report of
- 2 its findings and recommendations regarding the school supply
- 3 subsidy pilot program, including any proposed legislation, to
- 4 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 5 of the regular session of 2023.
- 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 to
- 9 establish and implement a one-year school supply subsidy pilot
- 10 program at Naalehu elementary school.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 education for the purposes of this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050, and
- 14 shall be repealed on January 1, 2023.
