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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BROADBAND SERVICE INFRASTRUCTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 206S-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended as follows:

3 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted4 and to read:

5 ""Broadband equity" means a condition in which all

6 residents are able to access, adopt, and use affordable, high-

7 speed, and reliable broadband that meets their needs."

8 2. By amending the definition of "digital equity" to read:
9 ""Digital equity" means a condition in which <u>broadband</u>
10 <u>equity is achieved and</u> all individuals and communities have the
11 information technology capacity needed for full participation in
12 society, democracy, and the economy."

13 SECTION 2. Section 206S-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows:

15 "[+]§206S-3[+] Hawaii broadband and digital equity office;
16 duties. (a) In furtherance of the State's objectives and



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1 policies for the economy pursuant to section 226-10.5, the 2 office shall: 3 Develop and implement specific strategies and plans to (1) 4 aggressively increase broadband affordability, 5 penetration, and competitive availability in the 6 State; 7 Support the efforts of both public and private (2) 8 entities in the State to enhance or facilitate the 9 deployment of and access to competitively priced, 10 advanced electronic communications services, including broadband and its products and services and internet 11 12 access services of general application throughout the 13 State; 14 (3) Promote the landing of trans-Pacific submarine cable, 15 including the development of a shared access cable 16 station and associated terrestrial connectivity to 17 reduce barriers to fiber landing in Hawaii; (4) Promote, advocate, and facilitate the implementation 18 19 of the findings and recommendations of the Hawaii 20 broadband task force established by Act 2, First

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1		Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, and the 2020
2		Hawaii Broadband Strategic Plan;
3	(5)	Support the findings of the community-based Broadband
4		Hui as reflected in its digital equity declaration;
5	(6)	Administer and coordinate federal and state grant
6		programs [in] <u>that</u> support [of] broadband
7		infrastructure, innovation, digital equity, and the
8		digital economy;
9	(7)	Actively seek out funding from public and private
10		sources [in furtherance of] <u>to further</u> the office's
11		duties pursuant to this section; and
12	(8)	Provide a repository, aggregation point, and
13		governance framework for broadband mapping and digital
14		equity data from various sources, including digital
15		literacy, telehealth, distance education, remote work,
16		internet accessibility, and service coverage to
17		support mapping, reporting, infrastructure deployment,
18		and data-driven policy.
19	(b)	The office may enter into contracts, in accordance
20	with chap	ter 103D, for consulting services to render
21	professio	nal and technical assistance and advice, and any other



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1	contracts	for consulting services that are necessary and proper
2	for the i	mplementation of its duties under subsection (a)."
3	SECT	ION 3. Section 206S-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
5	"(a)	The office shall:
6	(1)	Seek input and the widest possible cooperation from
7		public and private agencies and individuals to achieve
8		the purposes of this chapter;
9	(2)	Work closely with and assist the counties in the
10		promotion of coordinated state and county broadband
11		and digital equity planning;
12	(3)	Encourage every state department, county agency, and
13		other public or private agencies and individuals
14		involved in broadband programs to participate in the
15		activities of the office and incorporate, to the
16		extent feasible, the ideas and suggestions of the
17		participants in the office's comprehensive planning
18		goals;
19	(4)	Monitor the broadband-based development efforts of
20		other states and nations in areas such as business,
21		education, and health;

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1	(5)	Advise the department on other states' best practices
2		involving [remote work promotion and] policies and
3		strategies related to making digital equity and
4		affordable broadband services available to every home
5		and business in the State;
6	(6)	Monitor broadband-related activities at the federal
7		level;
8	(7)	Encourage public-private partnerships to increase the
9		deployment and adoption of broadband services and
10		applications;
11	(8)	Monitor regulatory and policy changes for potential
12		impact on digital equity and broadband deployment and
13		sustainability in the State; and
14	(9)	Advise the director of business, economic development,
15		and tourism on digital equity and broadband
16		deployment."
17	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
18	revenues o	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
19	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
20	ful	l-time equivalent (
21	exempt fro	om chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for the



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operation and administration of the Hawaii broadband and digital
 equity office.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
4 broadband and digital equity office for the purposes of this
5 Act.

6 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
