A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE PARKS.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the division of
- 2 state parks of the department of land and natural resources
- 3 oversees and has jurisdiction over fifty park units encompassing
- 4 thirty thousand acres throughout the State, which are composed
- 5 of some of the State's most sought after and cherished natural,
- 6 cultural, and historical resources. The state park system
- 7 offers a wide variety of outdoor recreation and cultural
- 8 heritage features ranging from landscaped grounds with
- facilities to scenic beaches and wildland areas with rustic
- 10 camping and hiking opportunities. These park units enable
- 11 residents and visitors to connect with nature and experience
- 12 Hawaii's unique history.
- 13 The legislature further finds that with only one hundred
- 14 twenty-eight positions for staffing, the state park system is
- 15 the least staffed park system in the United States, in the
- 16 bottom six state park systems in terms of funding, even though
- 17 it is in the top twenty in terms of parks patronized by



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- 1 recreational users and visitors. Furthermore, social media and
- 2 outdoor trends are increasing patronage to state parks, adding
- 3 greater impact and demand on aging infrastructure and fragile
- 4 natural and cultural resources, and taxing the very limited
- 5 capacity of inadequate staffing.
- **6** During the brief hiatus of public use during the COVID-19
- 7 pandemic due to closures in 2020, the state parks system
- 8 increased parking, entry, camping, and lodging fees. The
- 9 parking and entry fee increases are currently applied to out-of-
- 10 state visitors at nine state parks. With the robust return of
- 11 visitor arrivals in 2021, combined with other park revenue
- 12 sources, revenue from state parks is expected to exceed
- 13 \$12,000,000 by the end of fiscal year 2022. The legislature
- 14 also finds that the expenditure ceiling for the state parks
- 15 special fund in fiscal year 2021 is \$93,312.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to increase the state parks
- 17 special fund ceiling to \$12,000,000 by appropriating funds from
- 18 the special fund to reinvest the revenue derived from out-of-
- 19 state visitors into the state park system to improve the quality
- 20 of maintenance, management, and public safety and to be more

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- 1 responsive with repairs and maintenance associated with the
- 2 impacts of visitation and authorized and illicit uses.
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the state parks
- 4 special fund the sum of \$12,000,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 5 necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the purposes authorized
- 6 under section 184-3.4, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 8 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
