A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SERVICE-LEARNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that learning through 2 community service volunteering activities, known as service-3 learning, is a powerful instructional strategy for improving the 4 educational performance of students. Students who participate 5 in service-learning experience numerous positive outcomes, 6 including a positive development of character, values, 7 self-esteem, civic responsibility, and knowledge of local community issues and concerns; higher academic achievement; 8 9 higher attendance rates; a greater sense of civic 10 responsibility; greater acceptance of cultural diversity; increased awareness of cultural difference; positive attitudes 11 toward helping others; greater social competency; lower dropout 12 13 rates; lower disciplinary rates; and lower rates of engagement in behaviors that lead to arrest or pregnancy. Community 14 15 leaders report that service-learning partnerships help to build positive community attitudes toward youths. In addition, 16



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1	schools that support service-learning are more likely to have
2	positive relationships within their communities.
3	The purpose of this Act is to require public schools to
4	implement a service-learning curriculum.
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding a new section to part II, subpart B, to be
7	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
8	" §302A- Service-learning curriculum. (a) No later
9	than the 2024-2025 school year, the department shall implement a
10	service-learning curriculum for students in grades nine through
11	twelve. The service-learning curriculum shall be approved by
12	the board. The purpose of the curriculum shall be to develop
13	character, values, self-esteem, civic responsibility, and
14	knowledge of local community issues and concerns through
15	community service volunteer work. Completion of the service-
16	learning curriculum shall be a requirement for graduation.
17	(b) The service-learning curriculum shall:
18	(1) Specify a minimum number of hours of community service
19	volunteer work that shall be completed by each
20	student;



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1	(2)	Include evidence-based and applied instructional
2		practices for developing service-learning skills;
3	(3)	Identify the ways that the curriculum aligns with and
4		is supportive of common core state standards;
5	(4)	Require students to learn and develop through active
6		participation in thoughtfully organized community
7		service volunteer work that shall:
8		(A) Be conducted in, and meet the needs of, a
9		community;
10		(B) Be coordinated with a secondary school and the
11		community; and
12		(C) Help to foster civic responsibility;
13	(5)	Be integrated into and enhance the students'
14		standards-based curriculum;
15	(6)	Provide structured time for each student to reflect on
16		the student's volunteer experience;
17	(7)	Provide model lessons and activities specific to each
18		grade level; and
19	(8)	Identify supporting instructional materials.
20	<u>(c)</u>	The service-learning curriculum shall be posted on the
21	departmen	t's website. The website shall also encourage private



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1	schools and charter schools to follow the service-learning
2	curriculum."
