A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 2 statewide homelessness information system working group to
- 3 assess the feasibility of establishing a statewide information
- 4 system that collects and tracks real-time data related to
- 5 homelessness in the State, including availability of services,
- 6 shelters, and low-cost housing in various regions of the State,
- 7 that could be utilized by various government agencies to provide
- 8 efficient and effective assistance to individuals experiencing
- 9 homelessness or at-risk individuals.
- 10 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department
- 11 of human services for administrative purposes only, the
- 12 statewide homelessness information system working group.
- 13 (b) The working group shall consist of the following
- 14 members:
- 15 (1) Director of human services or the director's designee;
- 16 (2) Governor's coordinator on homelessness or the
- 17 coordinator's designee;

- 3 (c) The working group shall assess the feasibility of
- 4 establishing a statewide information system that collects and
- 5 tracks real-time data related to homelessness in the State,
- 6 including the availability of services, shelters, and low-cost
- 7 housing in various regions of the State, that could be utilized
- 8 by various government agencies to provide efficient and
- 9 effective assistance to individuals experiencing homelessness or
- 10 at-risk individuals.
- 11 (d) The working group shall submit a report of its
- 12 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
- 13 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 14 to the convening of the regular session of 2023. The report
- 15 shall include an assessment of:
- 16 (1) The forms of statewide homelessness information
 17 systems that collect, track, and share data in
 18 compliance with federal and state laws and regulations
 19 pertaining to the protection of personal information,
 20 including the federal Privacy Act of 1974, and the

system most suitable for implementation in Hawaii;
