A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish a 2 statewide homelessness information system working group to 3 assess the feasibility of establishing a statewide information 4 system that collects and tracks real-time data related to 5 homelessness in the State, including availability of services, 6 shelters, and low-cost housing in various regions of the State, 7 and that may be utilized by various government agencies to 8 provide efficient and effective assistance to individuals 9 experiencing, or at risk of experiencing, homelessness. There is established within the department 10 SECTION 2. (a) of human services for administrative purposes only the statewide 11 12 homelessness information system working group. The working group shall consist of the following 13 (b) 14 members:

15 (1) The director of human services, or the director's16 designee;

3	(3)	One member representing Partners in Care who shall be
4		invited to serve on the working group;

11	(7)	The state public defender, or the state public

17		(B) Human services,
18		to be selected by the president of the senate, or the
19		chair's designee, who shall serve as co-chair of the
20		working group;

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1	(10)	The chair of the house of representatives standing

3		(A) Government reform; or
4		(B) Health, human services, and homelessness,
5		to be selected by the speaker of the house of
6		representatives, or the chair's designee, who shall
7		serve as co-chair of the working group;
8	(11)	The chief information officer of the State, or the
9		chief information officer's designee; and
10	(12)	The attorney general, or the attorney general's
11		designee.
12	(C)	The working group shall assess the feasibility of
13	establish	ing a statewide information system to collect and track
14	real-time	data related to homelessness in the State, including
15	the avail	ability of services, shelters, and low-cost housing in
16	various r	egions of the State, and that may be utilized by
17	various g	overnment agencies to provide efficient and effective
18	assistanc	e to individuals experiencing, or at risk of

20 (d) The working group shall submit a report of its21 findings and recommendations, including any proposed

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1 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2023. The report 2 shall include an assessment of: 3 4 The forms of statewide homelessness information (1)5 systems that may be used in the State to collect, track, and share data in compliance with federal and 6 7 state laws and regulations pertaining to the 8 protection of personal information, including the 9 federal Privacy Act of 1974, and the system most 10 suitable for implementation in the State; 11 The financial feasibility of establishing and (2) 12 maintaining the statewide homelessness information 13 system, including a cost-benefit analysis; and 14 (3) Whether funding for the operation of the statewide homelessness information system should be included in 15 16 the base budget of the department of human services. 17 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 19 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 and the 20 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 21 2023-2024 for the department of human services to contract with

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a third-party to prepare the report required by section 2 of
this Act.

3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department4 of human services for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31,6 2050.
