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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSES.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a nurse  
2 shortage in the State that has been exacerbated by the  
3 coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic. According to the department  
4 of commerce and consumer affairs, almost five thousand nurses  
5 left the field between 2019 and mid-year 2021, shrinking the  
6 total active workforce from 33,410 in 2019 to 28,548 in 2021.

7           The legislature further finds that experienced, highly  
8 qualified nurses from other states, territories, or foreign  
9 countries may wish to relocate to Hawaii. Certain qualified  
10 applicants for licensure by endorsement who are licensed in  
11 another state are eligible for a temporary permit to practice in  
12 the State while their applications are reviewed and verified.  
13 Expanding the eligibility for a temporary permit to certain  
14 registered nurses and qualified licensed practical nurses from  
15 other territories and foreign jurisdictions will enable more  
16 qualified health care professionals to quickly find employment  
17 and enter into the State's health care field.



1           The purpose of this Act is to allow for temporary permits  
2 to be issued to registered nurses and licensed practical nurses  
3 from a territory or foreign country who are seeking a state  
4 license by endorsement.

5           SECTION 2. Section 457-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
6 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

7           "(b) Licenses shall be granted either by:

8           (1) Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass  
9 a written examination in nursing subjects as  
10 determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage  
11 of the examination and compliance with the applicable  
12 requirements of this chapter and the rules of the  
13 board, the board shall issue to the applicant a  
14 license to practice nursing as a registered nurse; or

15           (2) Endorsement: The board may issue a license to  
16 practice nursing as a registered nurse by endorsement  
17 to an applicant who has been licensed as a registered  
18 nurse under the laws of another state, territory, or  
19 foreign country if the applicant has an unencumbered  
20 license and, in the opinion of the board, the  
21 applicant meets the qualifications required of



1 registered nurses in this State at the time of  
2 graduation. Pending verification of a valid,  
3 unencumbered license from another state, territory, or  
4 foreign country, a temporary permit may be issued for  
5 employment with a Hawaii employer."

6 SECTION 3. Section 457-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
7 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

8 "(b) Licenses shall be granted either by:

9 (1) Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass  
10 a written examination in nursing subjects as  
11 determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage  
12 of the examination and compliance with the applicable  
13 requirements of this chapter and the rules of the  
14 board, the board shall issue to the applicant a  
15 license to practice nursing as a licensed practical  
16 nurse; or

17 (2) Endorsement: The board may issue a license to  
18 practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse by  
19 endorsement to any applicant who has been licensed as  
20 a licensed practical nurse, or a person entitled to  
21 perform similar services under a different title,



1 under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign  
2 country if the applicant has an unencumbered license  
3 and, in the opinion of the board, the applicant meets  
4 the requirements for licensed practical nurses in this  
5 State at the time of graduation. Pending verification  
6 of a valid, unencumbered license from another state,  
7 territory, or foreign country, a temporary permit may  
8 be issued for employment with a Hawaii employer."

9 SECTION 4. Section 457-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
10 amended to read as follows:

11 "§457-13 **Exceptions.** This chapter does not prohibit:

12 (1) The furnishing of nursing assistance in an emergency;

13 (2) The practice of nursing, which is incidental to  
14 [~~their~~] the program of study [~~by~~] of students enrolled  
15 in nursing education programs accredited by the board;

16 (3) The practice of nursing under a nonrenewable permit  
17 by:

18 (A) A graduate of; or

19 (B) An applicant who has provided proof that the  
20 applicant has completed the entire educational



1 curriculum required for graduation for a nursing  
 2 license from,  
 3 a school [~~which~~] that is in or under the jurisdiction  
 4 of the United States[-] or a foreign jurisdiction, and  
 5 whose accreditation is recognized by the board;  
 6 provided that following completion of (A) or (B), the  
 7 candidate takes the first licensing examination  
 8 scheduled by any board of nursing recognized by the  
 9 board and has submitted to the board an application  
 10 for a license to practice nursing in this State; and  
 11 provided further that the permit shall be valid for  
 12 three months or until the results of the licensing  
 13 examination are received by the board;

14 (4) The practice of any legally qualified nurse of another  
 15 state who is employed by the United States or any  
 16 bureau, division, or agency thereof, while in the  
 17 discharge of the nurse's official duties;

18 (5) The practice of nursing in connection with healing by  
 19 prayer or spiritual means alone in accordance with the  
 20 tenets and practice of any well recognized church or  
 21 religious denomination, provided that no person



1 practicing such nursing claims to practice as a  
2 registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse; or  
3 (6) The administration of oral and topical medication and  
4 in emergency situations, other premeasured medication,  
5 by school health aides as provided in section  
6 321-242."

7 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

9 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
