A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that after-school
programming provides important learning and enrichment
opportunities for Hawaii's youth while allowing parents to
maintain employment. After-school programs keep students safe,
offer additional learning support, and provide parents peace of
mind that their children are constructively engaged.

7 The legislature further finds that after-school programs 8 are particularly needed for middle and intermediate school 9 students. The intermediate years are important for reversing 10 high school drop-out rates and ensuring students remain engaged 11 in their education and community. The R.E.A.C.H. initiative, which stands for "resources for enrichment, athletics, culture, 12 and health" was established in 2013 to meet the need for 13 14 dedicated after-school programs for public middle and 15 intermediate school students and uses a community-based approach. The R.E.A.C.H. initiative utilizes state funds and 16

partners with schools, parents, and other community-based
organizations.

The legislature additionally finds that in the face of the 3 4 ongoing pandemic, parents and the businesses and education 5 communities continue to see after-school programs as a resource 6 to promote youth and children's growth and development, while also helping parents maintain or find employment. Expanding 7 8 funding for after-school programs represents an upfront 9 investment in Hawaii's youth. With federal dollars already being invested in after-school programs, now is the time to 10 commit to expanding access to quality after-school programs for 11 12 public middle and intermediate students.

13 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the 14 resources for enrichment, athletics, culture, and health program 15 of the department of education to match the federal dollars that 16 the State receives for the 21st Century Community Learning 17 Center.

18 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for 21 the department of education's resources for enrichment,

4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of5 education for the purposes of this Act.

6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
