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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The legislature finds that pesticide use is  
2 associated with neurological deficits and acute health effects  
3 in children. Scientific research conducted by academic  
4 institutions and the Environmental Protection Agency has  
5 demonstrated that pesticides sprayed on agricultural fields can  
6 drift off site, causing adverse health effects. Drift can occur  
7 through spray, mist, fumes, or odor during application, or  
8 through volatilization of previously treated areas.

9           The legislature further finds that Act 45, Session Laws of  
10 Hawaii 2018, created a ban on chlorpyrifos--an excellent example  
11 of state regulatory action to protect the public from  
12 neurologically damaging pesticides. However, the legislature  
13 also finds that the one hundred foot buffer zone for schools is  
14 insufficient. Pesticide drift can occur at distances up to 0.8  
15 mile, or 4,224 feet, from the site of application. The  
16 legislature additionally finds that scientific evidence supports  
17 a one-half mile buffer from schools and public parks in order to



1 prevent acute health effects and long-term neurological impacts  
2 on Hawaii's children.

3 The purpose of this Act is to:

4 (1) Require the department of agriculture to use  
5 consistent units of measurement in its summary to the  
6 public on restricted use pesticides used; and

7 (2) Prohibit restricted use pesticides from being applied  
8 within one-half mile of schools or state or county  
9 public parks.

10 SECTION 2. Section 149A-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
11 amended to read as follows:

12 "[~~§~~§149A-27~~]~~ **Public reports; contents.** The department  
13 shall produce a summary, for public disclosure, by county, that  
14 includes:

15 (1) The total quantities used, in a consistent unit of  
16 measurement, by federal and state registrations or  
17 permit numbers, commercial product names, and active  
18 ingredients, for each restricted use pesticide used;  
19 and

20 (2) The amount of area in the county in which the  
21 restricted use application occurred."



1 SECTION 3. Section 149A-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:


3 "[~~§~~§149A-28~~§~~] **Buffer zones.** Beginning January 1,  
4 [~~2019,~~] 2023, no person shall apply a restricted use pesticide  
5 on or within [~~one hundred feet~~] one-half mile of a school  
6 property during normal school hours~~+~~ or a state or county  
7 public park; provided that this section shall not apply to whole  
8 structure fumigation; provided further that if this section is  
9 determined to conflict with any pesticide application  
10 information listed on the pesticide label, the more restrictive  
11 provision shall apply."

12 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

14 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

**Report Title:**

Pesticides; Buffer Zone; Restricted Use Pesticides; Consistent Unit of Measurement; Department of Agriculture

**Description:**

Requires the department of agriculture to use consistent units of measurement in its summary to the public on the amounts of restricted use pesticides used. Effective 1/1/2023, establishes a one-half mile buffer zone for pesticides around schools and state and county public parks.
