A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Part I

2 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that public trust in law
3 enforcement is critical to ensuring justice for all under the
4 law. The legislature further finds that the difficult and often
5 dangerous job of law enforcement is safer, easier, and more
6 effectively executed when citizens trust those empowered to
7 serve and protect them.

8 The purpose of this Act is to enhance the public's trust in
9 law enforcement and standardize best practices between the
10 counties by:

11 (1) Amending the law enforcement officer independent
12 review board to:

13 (A) Require review of any specific incident of
14 alleged misconduct recommended by certain
15 officials;

16 (B) Require members to serve four-year terms; and

17 (C) Make it a permanent board; and

1 (C) The mayor of the county in which the incident
2 occurred;

3 (D) The police commission of the county in which the
4 incident occurred;

5 (E) The chief of police of the county in which the
6 incident occurred; or

7 (F) A county council member of the district in which
8 the incident occurred."

9 2. By amending subsection (e) to read:

10 "(e) The members of the board shall serve without
11 compensation for [~~terms specified by the appointing authority,~~]
12 a term of four years, but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
13 including travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their
14 duties."

15 SECTION 3. Act 161, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, is
16 amended by amending section 7 to read as follows:

17 "SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017;
18 provided that:

19 (1) Section 4 of this Act shall take effect on July 1,
20 2016; and

Part III

11 SECTION 4. Section 139-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12 amended to read as follows:

13 "**[+]§139-2[+]** **Law enforcement standards board;**

14 **establishment.** (a) There is established the law enforcement
15 standards board within the department of the attorney general
16 for administrative purposes only. The purpose of the board
17 shall be to provide programs and standards for training and
18 certification of law enforcement officers. The law enforcement
19 standards board shall consist of the following voting members:
20 nine ex officio individuals[~~, two law enforcement officers,~~] or
21 their designees and [~~four~~] five members of the public.

- 1 (1) The nine ex officio members of the board shall consist
2 of the:
- 3 (A) Attorney general[+] or the attorney general's
4 designee;
- 5 (B) Director of public safety[+] or the director's
6 designee;
- 7 (C) Director of transportation or the director's
8 designee;
- 9 (D) Chairperson of the board of land and natural
10 resources or the chairperson's designee;
- 11 (E) Director of taxation or the director's designee;
12 and
- 13 (F) Chiefs of police of the four counties[+] or the
14 designees of each of the chiefs of police; and
- 15 [~~2~~] ~~The two law enforcement officers shall each have at~~
16 ~~least ten years of experience as a law enforcement~~
17 ~~officer and shall be appointed by the governor; and~~
- 18 ~~3~~] (2) The [~~four~~] five members of the public shall
19 consist of one member of the public each from [~~each of~~
20 ~~the four counties~~] the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and
21 Kauai and two members of the public from the city and

1 county of Honolulu, and shall be appointed by the
2 governor. [~~At least two of the four~~] The five members
3 of the public holding a position on the board at any
4 given time shall:

5 (A) Possess a master's or doctorate degree related to
6 criminal justice;

7 (B) Possess a law degree and have experience:

8 (i) Practicing in Hawaii as a deputy attorney
9 general, a deputy prosecutor, deputy public
10 defender, or private criminal defense
11 attorney; or

12 (ii) Litigating constitutional law issues in
13 Hawaii;

14 (C) Be a recognized expert in the field of criminal
15 justice, policing, or security; or

16 (D) Have work experience in a law enforcement
17 capacity; provided that experience in a county
18 police department shall not itself be sufficient
19 to qualify under this paragraph.

20 (b) The [~~law enforcement officers and the~~] members of the
21 public on the board shall serve for a term of [~~three~~] four



1 years[7]; provided that the initial terms shall be staggered, as
2 determined by the governor.

3 (c) The [~~law enforcement officers and the~~] members of the
4 public on the board shall receive no salary for their duties as
5 members of the board, but shall be entitled to reimbursement for
6 expenses, including travel expenses, necessary for the
7 performance of their duties as board members."

8 SECTION 5. Section 139-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 amended to read as follows:

10 "**§139-3 Powers and duties of the board.** The board shall:

- 11 (1) Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 to implement
12 this chapter;
- 13 (2) Establish minimum standards for employment as a law
14 enforcement officer and to certify persons to be
15 qualified as law enforcement officers;
- 16 (3) Establish criteria and standards in which a person who
17 has been denied certification, whose certification has
18 been revoked by the board, or whose certification has
19 lapsed may reapply for certification;
- 20 (4) Establish minimum criminal justice curriculum
21 requirements for basic, specialized, and in-service

1 courses and programs for schools operated by or for
2 the State or a county for the specific purpose of
3 training law enforcement officers;

4 (5) Consult and cooperate with the counties, agencies of
5 the State, other governmental agencies, universities,
6 colleges, and other institutions concerning the
7 development of law enforcement officer training
8 schools and programs of criminal justice instruction;

9 (6) Employ, subject to chapter 76, an administrator and
10 other persons necessary to carry out its duties under
11 this chapter;

12 (7) Investigate when there is reason to believe that a law
13 enforcement officer does not meet the minimum
14 standards for employment, and in so doing, may:

15 (A) Subpoena persons, books, records, or documents;
16 (B) Require answers in writing under oath to
17 questions asked by the board; and
18 (C) Take or cause to be taken depositions as needed
19 in investigations, hearings, and other
20 proceedings,
21 related to the investigation;

- 1 (8) Establish and require participation in continuing
2 education programs for law enforcement officers;
- 3 (9) Have the authority to charge and collect fees for
4 applications for certification as a law enforcement
5 officer;
- 6 (10) Establish procedures and criteria for the revocation
7 of certification issued by the board;
- 8 (11) Have the authority to revoke certifications; ~~and~~
- 9 (12) Review and recommend statewide policies and procedures
10 relating to law enforcement, including the use of
11 force[-];
- 12 (13) Consider studies relevant to the board's objectives,
13 including but not limited to the study that examines
14 consolidating the law enforcement activities and
15 responsibilities of various state divisions and
16 agencies under a single, centralized state enforcement
17 division or agency, conducted pursuant to Act 124,
18 Session Laws of Hawaii 2018; and
- 19 (14) Conduct its own study to evaluate how to efficiently
20 and effectively satisfy its duties in accordance with
21 the law."
