## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO INCLUDE THE TEACHING OF FINANCIAL LITERACY IN THE EXISTING PERSONAL TRANSITION PLAN COURSE REQUIREMENT FOR EACH STUDENT.

WHEREAS, in the past, the educational system has assumed 1 that students will learn important financial skills from their 2 3 families; and 4 5 WHEREAS, not all students are being taught the financial skills they will need to be successful later in life; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the lack of financial literacy in students poses a 9 significant barrier for individuals seeking to achieve financial 10 prosperity and stability; and 11 12 WHEREAS, personal financial education is essential to ensure that our youth are prepared to manage money, credit, and 13 debt and to become responsible workers, heads of households, 14 15 investors, entrepreneurs, business leaders, and citizens; and 16 WHEREAS, it is of the utmost importance to educate Hawaii's 17 youth in economic and financial matters to prepare them for 18 financial independence through the development of fiscal 19 responsibility and financial management skills; and 20 21 WHEREAS, although the Department of Education offers a 22 financial literacy elective course, it is not required; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, some amount of basic skills and knowledge of financial literacy should be required for all students; now, 26 therefore, 27 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 30 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 31 32 Education is urged to include the teaching of financial literacy



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in the existing personal transition plan course requirement for 1 each student; and 2 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is urged to ensure consistency in the financial literacy course 5 across all Department of Education high schools; and 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 8 9 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education and Chairperson of the Board of Education. 10 11 12 13
