SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN TO WORK WITH THE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ACTION CENTER, THE FILIPINO CHAMBER OF COMMERCE IN HAWAI'I, AND OTHER CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE OF HAWAII, AS APPROPRIATE, TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT AN OUTREACH PROGRAM AIMED AT INFORMING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE VICTIMS OF AVAILABLE RESOURCES FOR ASSISTANCE.

1 WHEREAS, domestic violence is often an undetected problem
2 that can have deadly consequences; and
3

4 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, one in three women and one in four men
5 have had some form of physical abuse by their partner; and
6

7 WHEREAS, the number of reported domestic violence cases in
8 Hawaii spiked during the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic and
9 is expected to continue growing as the State recovers from the
10 economic effects of the pandemic; and
11

12 WHEREAS, according to the National Coalition Against
13 Domestic Violence, Asian and Pacific Islander communities
14 experience domestic violence at much higher rates than the
15 general population; and
16

17 WHEREAS, Filipinos and part-Filipinos, who represent
18 approximately twenty-five percent of Hawaii's population,
19 constitute thirty percent of reported victims of domestic abuse
20 in the State, and are therefore overrepresented as domestic
21 violence victims in Hawaii; and
22

23 WHEREAS, the State Commission on the Status of Women acts
24 as a coordinating body for governmental and nongovernmental
25 activities and information relating to the status of women; and
26

27 WHEREAS, the Domestic Violence Action Center is a nonprofit
28 corporation committed to addressing domestic violence and other
29 forms of harm through leadership, unique services, legal



1 representation, survivor and system advocacy, community
2 education, and social change work; and
3

4 WHEREAS, the Domestic Violence Action Center has staff who
5 are specifically trained in and have knowledge of various
6 cultures, including Filipino, Compacts of Free Association
7 freely associated states, Korean, and Japanese cultures, as well
8 as the unique needs of the LGBTQ+ community, and can also
9 provide culturally-sensitive services, including translation and
10 creation of posters and signage in various languages; and
11

12 WHEREAS, members of the Filipino Chamber of Commerce of
13 Hawai'i can assist in informing domestic violence victims of the
14 means by which they can receive help, including placing posters
15 and signage in discreet areas including restrooms; now,
16 therefore,

18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the
20 House of Representatives concurring, that the State Commission
21 on the Status of Women is urged to work with the Domestic
22 Violence Action Center, the Filipino Chamber of Commerce of
23 Hawai'i, and other chambers of commerce in Hawaii, as
24 appropriate, to develop and implement an outreach program aimed
25 at informing domestic violence victims of various sources of
26 assistance, including placement of posters and signage in
27 various languages in discreet areas; and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Commission on the
30 Status of Women is requested to submit a report of its progress
31 in the development and implementation of the outreach program,
32 findings and recommendations, and proposed legislation if any,
33 to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
34 convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and


36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
