## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS SUPPORT THE PASSAGE OF H.R. 4803, THE ACUPUNCTURE FOR OUR SENIORS ACT OF 2021, WHICH WOULD AMEND TITLE XVIII OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR ACUPUNCTURIST SERVICES UNDER THE MEDICARE PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, there is an acute need to address pain and 1 addiction issues with complementary and integrative services, 2 including acupuncture; and 3 4 WHEREAS, extensive studies on acupuncture published by the 5 National Center for Complementary and Integrative Health show 6 that acupuncture is a viable treatment option for those 7 suffering from musculoskeletal conditions, chronic pain, and 8 addiction issues; and 9 10 WHEREAS, these studies have also shown that acupuncture is 11 generally considered safe when performed by an experienced, 12 well-trained practitioner using sterile needles; and 13 14 WHEREAS, having acupuncture performed by a well-trained 15 practitioner is as important to public health and safety as 16 17 having healthcare services performed by a healthcare professional having an extensive educational and clinical 18 19 training history; and 20 WHEREAS, reflecting the scientific consensus that 21 acupuncture is a safe practice when performed by an experienced, 22 well-trained practitioner using sterile needles, the Center for 23 Medicare and Medicaid Services issued a national coverage 24 determination in January 2020 to have Medicare cover acupuncture 25 services for Medicare benefit recipients experiencing chronic 26 27 lower back pain; now, therefore, 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 29 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 30

House of Representatives concurring, that the United States Congress is requested to support H.R. 4803, the Acupuncture for Our Seniors Act of 2021, which would amend Title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide coverage for acupuncturist services under the Medicare program; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 8 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader of 9 the United States Senate, Speaker of the United States House of 10 Representatives, and members of Hawaii's congressional 11 delegation.
