SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO PROVIDE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR A PILOT PROGRAM THAT GRANTS PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY TO QUALIFIED PSYCHOLOGISTS IN THE COUNTIES OF KAUA'I, MAUI, AND HAWAI'I.

1 WHEREAS, there is a significant shortage of prescribing mental health care providers available to serve the needs of the 2 State's residents in rural or medically underserved communities, 3 especially in Hawai'i, Maui, and Kaua'i counties; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the lack of access to appropriate mental health 6 7 treatment has serious and irrevocable consequences; and 8 9 WHEREAS, according to the Department of Health, death by 10 suicide is the number one injury-related cause of death among 11 Hawai'i residents; and 12 13 WHEREAS, studies have shown that people who attempt or commit suicide often received inadequate or no mental health 14 treatment due to a shortage of mental health providers; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, while the causes for suicide can be complex, the most commonly reported contributing factors are mental health 18 19 conditions that, when identified and treated, respond favorably 20 to therapy and psychotropic medication; and 21 WHEREAS, clinical psychologists are licensed health 22 professionals with an average of seven years of post-23 baccalaureate study and three thousand hours of post-graduate 24 25 supervised practice in diagnosis and treatment of mental illness; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the American Psychological Association has 28 29 developed a model curriculum for a Master's Degree in 30 psychopharmacology for the education and training of prescribing 31 psychologists; however, the existing scope of clinical



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psychologists' practice in Hawai'i does not include prescribing 1 2 medications; and 3 WHEREAS, Hawai'i has previously authorized prescription 4 5 privileges for a number of other health care professionals, and federal facilities have long allowed licensed clinical 6 7 psychologists with specialized education and training to 8 prescribe psychotropic medications in certain circumstances; and 9 WHEREAS, residents living on the neighbor islands are 10 disproportionately affected by the State's physician shortage, 11 which is attributed to factors such as rural or qeographically 12 challenged locations, high costs of living, heavy tax burdens, 13 14 and low reimbursements; and 15 WHEREAS, these factors were further exacerbated by the 16 effects of the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, authorizing qualified clinical psychologists with appropriate advanced training to prescribe from a limited 20 formulary of psychotropic medication will benefit Hawai'i 21 22 residents; and 23 24 WHEREAS, granting prescriptive authority to qualified 25 psychologists will help meet the demands for psychological services in vulnerable populations and provide greater access to 26 permanent mental health services provided by clinical 27 psychologists, especially to those who live in rural or 28 29 medically underserved communities; and 30 31 WHEREAS, establishing a pilot program that grants prescriptive authority to qualified psychologists who practice 32 on the neighbor islands is a valuable first step in improving 33 34 access to quality healthcare in the State and identifying the efficacy and value of a proposal for a future comprehensive 35 statewide policy; now, therefore, 36 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 38 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 39 40 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs is requested to convene a task 41 force to evaluate and provide recommendations to establish a 42



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pilot program that grants prescriptive authority to qualified 1 psychologist applicants in the counties of Hawai'i, Maui, and 2 Kaua'i; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the task force, with the assistance 5 of the Board of Psychology, is requested to submit a report of 6 its findings and recommendations, including any proposed 7 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 8 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be dissolved on 11 12 June 30, 2023; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 15 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and Executive Officer of the Board of 16 17 Psychology. 18 19 20 OFFERED BY:
