SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE SCHOOL FACILITIES AUTHORITY TO ADOPT AND PUBLISH ADMINISTRATIVE RULES NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT ACT 72, SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII 2020, AS AMENDED, BY NO LATER THAN JULY 1, 2023, AND THE GOVERNOR TO SUBMIT A RELATED REPORT.

1 WHEREAS, Act 72, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020 (Act 72),
2 established the School Facilities Agency to be a body corporate
3 and a public instrumentality of the State for the purposes of
4 being responsible for public school development, planning, and
5 construction related to capital improvement projects assigned to
6 the Legislature, Governor, or Board of Education; and

8 WHEREAS, Act 217, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, renamed the
9 agency as the School Facilities Authority; and

11 WHEREAS, there are presently no administrative rules to
12 implement Act 72, as amended; and

14 WHEREAS, there is presently a lack of clarity regarding the
15 process by which the School Facilities Authority purchases real
16 property and executes capital improvement project contracts;
17 now, therefore,

19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the
21 House of Representatives concurring, that the School Facilities
22 Authority is requested to adopt and publish administrative rules
23 in accordance with chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as
24 necessary to implement Act 72, as amended, by no later than
25 July 1, 2023; and

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to
28 submit a report documenting the process by which the School
29 Facilities Authority purchases real property and executes
30 capital improvement project contracts to the Legislature no





1 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular
