SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION DIVISION AND THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCILS, TO CONTRACT THE REVIEW OF PROPOSED AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECTS TO THIRD-PARTY CONSULTANTS.

WHEREAS, the onset of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-1 2 19) pandemic led to an unprecedented economic crisis that decimated Hawai'i's economy and caused its gross domestic product 3 to plummet; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the drastic decline in economic activity 6 7 disproportionately affected the State's most vulnerable 8 populations; and 9 WHEREAS, the forced shutdown of many sectors of the State's 10 economy triggered mass layoffs and furloughs causing the State's 11 seasonally adjusted unemployment to surge from 2.4 percent in 12 March 2020 to a historical high of 22.3 percent in April 2020; 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, record unemployment, mass layoffs and furloughs, 16 17 and increased daily expenses for Hawai'i residents exacerbated issues already being faced by renter households due to 18 historically high housing cost burdens; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic exacerbated the burden on renter households, as more than eleven 22 thousand Hawai'i tenants fell behind on rent payments and forty 23 24 percent of rental tenants lost their jobs; and 25 26 WHEREAS, while the dissemination of COVID-19 vaccines has allowed Hawai'i's economy to slowly rebound from the devastating 27 impacts of mass layoffs and economic shutdowns, data from the 28



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1 University of Hawai'i Economic Research Organization showed that the number of individuals facing homelessness will rise; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the decline and cessation of COVID-19 pandemic-4 5 related aid, subsidies, and relief for Hawai'i's residents, including renter households, will increase significant 6 7 challenges to households struggling to attain jobs, make payments on past due rent, and return to normal life; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, in February 2022, inflation in the United States hit a record 7.5 percent, increasing the burden on Hawai'i 11 residents who are continuing to struggle from the impacts of the 12 13 COVID-19 pandemic; and 14 WHEREAS, immediate action is imperative to mitigate the 15 affordable housing crisis that is both ongoing and exacerbated 16 17 by the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic; now, therefore, 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 20 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land 21 22 and Natural Resources, through the State Historic Preservation Division, is requested to contract its review of proposed state 23 projects, projects on privately-owned historic property, and 24 25 projects affecting historic properties to third-party consultants if the projects involve the development of 26 27 affordable housing; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that after an initial evaluation, if 30 the Department of Land and Natural Resources is not able to provide its written concurrence or non-concurrence within sixty 31 days of the filing of the request, the Department of Land and 32 Natural Resources is requested to contract a third-party 33 34 consultant to conduct the review; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested to receive pre-approval of the 37 appropriate island burial council before contracting services 38 39 with a third-party consultant; and 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department is requested to 41 contract third-party consultants who meet the educational and 42



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experiences standards and qualifications for preservation 1 professionals as determined by the State Historic Preservation 2 3 Division Rules; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that third-party consultants are requested to provide a recommendation to the Department of Land 6 and Natural Resources within thirty days of the filing of the 7 8 request with the Department of Land and Natural Resources; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 11 Natural Resources is requested to submit its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 12 13 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 14 the Regular Session of 2023; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 17 18 Board of Land and Natural Resources; Administrator of the State 19 Historic Preservation Division; and Island Burial Councils of Hawaii, Kauai and Niihau, Maui and Lanai, Molokai, and Oahu. 20
