
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO EXAMINE ISSUES AND
BARRIERS TO ENFORCEMENT TO REDUCE NOISE FROM TWO-STROKE
ENGINES, MOPEDS, AND SMALL OFF-ROAD ENGINES AND MAKE
RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE TO HELP REDUCE NOISE
POLLUTION FROM THESE SOURCES.

1 WHEREAS, noise pollution is a serious, prevalent, and
2 increasing problem affecting peace, tranquility, and quality of
3 life in the State, particularly in urban areas, but also in
4 suburban and rural areas; and

5
6 WHEREAS, Hawaii residents should not be exposed to noise
7 pollution that is hazardous to their health or welfare as
8 excessively loud and unabated noises can result in
9 physiological, psychological, and economic damage; and

10
11 WHEREAS, efforts to protect communities from noise
12 pollution have been codified under chapter 342F, Hawaii Revised
13 Statutes, and in chapter 11-46, Hawaii Administrative Rules; and

14
15 WHEREAS, in addition, section 46-17, Hawaii Revised
16 Statutes, authorizes any county to adopt ordinances regulating
17 noise, among other things; and

18
19 WHEREAS, existing regulatory measures lack effective
20 enforcement and do not adequately address noise pollution; and

21
22 WHEREAS, loud two-stroke engines, such as internal
23 combustion engine mopeds, are significant contributors that have
24 raised ongoing concerns in communities throughout the State; and

25
26 WHEREAS, mopeds and other motor vehicles with after-market
27 modifications to engine or exhaust systems are often many times
28 louder than what is allowable; and

1 WHEREAS, small off-road engines, which are used primarily
2 in lawn and garden equipment, can also emit excessive noise; and

4 WHEREAS, excessively loud vehicles and small off-road
5 engines, such as leaf blowers and other lawn and garden
6 equipment, are difficult to regulate because of the mobile and
7 dispersed nature of this type of equipment; now, therefore,
8

9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the
11 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
12 Health is requested to examine issues and barriers to
13 enforcement of restrictions to reduce noise pollution, including
14 the possibility of funding commercial rebates or similar
15 incentive funding to support the transition to quieter
16 operations by zero-emission mopeds and small off-road equipment;

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is
20 requested to prepare and submit a report of its findings and
21 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
22 Legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of
23 the Regular Session of 2023; and

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
26 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health.
