## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO ENACT FEDERAL LEGISLATION GRANTING STATEHOOD TO THE PEOPLE OF WASHINGTON, D.C.

WHEREAS, the people living on the land that would 1 2 eventually be designated as the District of Columbia were provided the right to vote for representation in Congress when 3 the United States Constitution was ratified in 1788; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the passage of the Organic Act of 1801 placed the 6 District of Columbia under the exclusive authority of the United 7 States Congress and abolished residents' right to vote for 8 members of Congress and the President and Vice President of the 9 10 United States; and 11 WHEREAS, residents of the District of Columbia were granted 12 the right to vote for the President and Vice President of the 13 14 United States through passage of the Twenty-third Amendment to the United States Constitution in 1961; and 15 16 WHEREAS, based on its annual estimate of resident 17 populations, April 1, 2020, to July 1, 2021, United States 18 Census Bureau data estimates the District of Columbia's resident 19 population at approximately 689,545 residents, which is 20 comparable to the resident populations of Wyoming (576,851), 21 Vermont (643,077), Alaska (733,391), and North Dakota (779,094); 22 23 and 24 WHEREAS, residents of the District of Columbia share all 25 the responsibilities of United States citizenship, including 26 paying more federal taxes than residents of twenty-two states, 27 service on federal juries, and defending the United States as 28 members of the United States Armed Forces in every war since the 29

1 War for Independence, yet District of Columbia residents are denied full representation in Congress; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the residents of the District of Columbia 5 themselves have endorsed statehood for the District of Columbia and passed a District-wide referendum on November 8, 2016, which 6 7 favored statehood by eighty-six percent; and 8 9 WHEREAS, no other democratic nation denies the right of 10 self-government, including participation in its national legislature, to the residents of its capital; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the residents of the District of Columbia lack 13 14 full democracy, equality, and citizenship enjoyed by the 15 residents of the fifty states; and 16 WHEREAS, the United States Congress repeatedly has 17 interfered with the District of Columbia's limited self-18 19 government by enacting laws that affect the District of 20 Columbia's expenditure of its locally raised tax revenue, including barring the usage of locally raised revenue, thus 21 violating the fundamental principle that states and local 22 23 governments are best suited to enact legislation that represents 24 the will of their citizens; and 25 26 WHEREAS, although the District of Columbia has passed consecutive balanced budgets since the 1997 fiscal year, it 27 still faces the possibility of being shut down yearly because of 28 29 Congressional deliberations over the federal budget; and 30 31 WHEREAS, District of Columbia Delegate Eleanor Holmes 32 Norton and Delaware United States Senator Tom Carper reintroduced in the 117th Congress H.R. 51 and S. 51, 33 respectively, the Washington, D.C. Admission Act, that provides 34 that the State of Washington, D.C. would have all the rights of 35 citizenship as taxpaying American citizens, including two 36 senators and at least one member of the House of 37 Representatives; and 38 39 40 WHEREAS, the United Nations Human Rights Committee has called on the United States Congress to address the District of 41 42 Columbia's lack of political equality, and the Organization of

American States has declared the disenfranchisement of the 1 District of Columbia residents a violation of its charter 2 agreement, to which the United States is a signatory; now, 3 therefore, 4

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 6 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 7 House of Representatives concurring, that the members of the 8 United States Congress are urged to enact federal legislation 9 10 granting statehood to the people of Washington, D.C.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State of Hawaii supports 12 admitting Washington, D.C., into the Union as a state of the 13 United States of America; and 14

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 16 17 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the members of Hawaii's 18 congressional delegation. 19
