SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO
ADDRESS THE STATE'S SCHOOL BUS DRIVER SHORTAGE.

1 WHEREAS, the availability of school bus service is
2 essential to student attendance; and

3
4 WHEREAS, school bus service is particularly crucial for
5 families who live in rural and remote areas and students who
6 come from socioeconomically disadvantaged communities; and

7
8 WHEREAS, the United States of America is currently
9 experiencing a national school bus driver shortage; and

10
11 WHEREAS, the school bus driver shortage followed the start
12 of the COVID-19 pandemic, when the transition to virtual
13 learning caused a mass exodus of bus drivers who became sick
14 with the COVID-19 virus, were furloughed from their jobs, or
15 decided to quit; and

16
17 WHEREAS, according to an August 2021 survey by the National
18 Association for Pupil Transportation, seventy-eight percent of
19 the 1,500 responding school districts reported being in the
20 midst of a worsening bus driver shortage crisis, with fifty-one
21 percent describing their shortage issues as "severe" or
22 "desperate"; and

24 WHEREAS, the national bus driver shortage has also impacted
25 Hawaii, which has caused dozens of bus routes to be temporarily
26 suspended and left families scrambling to find alternative ways
27 to transport their children to school; and

28
29 WHEREAS, in August of 2021, the Department of Education
30 reported being short by one hundred drivers out of six hundred

1 fifty total positions, amounting to a shortage rate of over
2 fifteen percent; and

3
4 WHEREAS, states and school districts across the country
5 have taken steps to relieve the school bus driver shortage,
6 including through the provision of financial incentives; now,
7 therefore,

8
9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the
11 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
12 Education is urged to convene a working group to address
13 Hawaii's school bus driver shortage; and

14
15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of
16 Education, or the Superintendent's designee, is requested to
17 serve on the working group; and

18
19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
20 requested to invite the following to serve as members of the
21 working group:

- 22
23 (1) The Chairperson of the Board of Education, or the
24 Chairperson's designee;
25
26 (2) The Director of Transportation, or the Director's
27 designee;
28
29 (3) A representative of the Department of Transportation
30 Services of the City and County of Honolulu;

32 (4) A representative of the Department of Public Works of
33 the County of Hawaii;

35 (5) A representative of the Transportation Agency of the
36 County of Kauai; and

38 (6) A representative of the Department of Transportation
39 of the County of Maui; and

41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
42 requested to invite representatives from Ground Transportation

1 Inc.; Roberts Hawaii; and any other transportation company who
2 the Department of Education contracts with to provide school bus
3 service in the State; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
6 to submit a report of its findings and recommendations regarding
7 school bus service, including any proposed legislation, to the
8 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
9 the Regular Session of 2023; and

10

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
13 Board of Education; Interim Superintendent of Education;
14 Director of Transportation; Director of Transportation Services
15 of the City and County of Honolulu; Director of Public Works of
16 the County of Hawaii; Executive of the Transportation Agency of
17 the County of Kauai; Director of Transportation of the County of
18 Maui; President of Ground Transportation, Inc.; and Chief
19 Executive Officer of Roberts Hawaii.
