

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

	REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE ECONOMIC IMPACTS OF DOMESTIC OUT-OF-STATE STUDENTS.
1 2 3	WHEREAS, Hawaii is a tropical destination for tourists and students alike; and
4 5 6 7	WHEREAS, as the State seeks to diversify its economy, it is critical for businesses and industries to provide good jobs and growth potential; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS, the education sector is capable of providing both good jobs and growth potential; and
11 12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, in a report dated October 2020 and titled, "The Economic Impact of International Students in Hawaii2020 Update" (2020 Report), the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism analyzed the impact of international students on Hawaii's economy; and
16 17 18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, the 2020 Report estimated that, in calendar year 2019, international students directly contributed \$185,000,000 to the state economy in living expenses and tuition, among other economic activities; and
22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, the 2020 Report also estimated the "ripple effect", or indirect economic impact, of international students, as follows:
25 26 27 28	\$381,200,00 in economic output generated, including direct, indirect, and induced effects;
28 29 30	(2) \$29,200,000 in state taxes generated;
30 31 32	(3) \$168,400,000 in household income generated; and

Nearly four-thousand jobs supported by international (4)1 2 student spending; and 3 WHEREAS, the 2020 Report illustrates the powerful economic 4 impact of international students in the State, and, by 5 implication, the powerful impact that other out-of-state 6 7 students likely have on the economy as well; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 11 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to 12 conduct a study on the economic impacts of domestic out-of-state 13 students, i.e., non-international students, on the state 14 economy, in similar scope and form as the 2020 Report; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in conducting the study, the 17 Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is 18 requested to analyze the economic impacts of all domestic, out-19 of-state students in the State, including four-year degree 20 21 students, two-year degree students, and short-term students; and 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 23 24 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any 25 proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty 26 27 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of 30 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism. 31 32 33 34 OFFERED BY:
