## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO EXPAND TRANSPORTATION SERVICES IN THE PEARL CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Pearl City School District is experiencing a transportation shortage, primarily due to a reported bus driver shortage; and

WHEREAS, transportation issues and bus driver shortages in the Pearl City School District have existed since at least 1991; and

WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic and related impacts have exacerbated the transportation shortage during 2021; and

WHEREAS, safe and reliable transportation to and from school is critical to academic success; and

WHEREAS, parents have reported that more than a dozen Pearl City students currently lack transportation services and are on a waitlist; and

WHEREAS, according to the Department of Education's Student Transportation Services Branch:

(1) Students must live at least one mile away from the school to qualify for regular school bus service;

(2) Students who live less than one mile may be waitlisted for bus service even if there are unused seats on the bus and it will not result in cost to the State;

Only full-sized school buses are deployed for most (3) routes and routes must have a minimum number of student riders (i.e., forty-eight for elementary schools) to qualify for bus service;

Students not qualifying for a free bus pass are (4)1 required to pay up to \$72.00, quarterly, for 2 transportation services; 3 4 (5) Approximately fifteen-thousand students use bus 5 services on Oahu and eighteen-thousand use bus 6 7 services on the neighbor islands; and (6) Pearl City School enrollment is approximately five 9 thousand, and approximately five hundred of these 10 students use bus services to and from school; and 11 12 WHEREAS, to address the current transportation shortage, 13 the Department of Education launched a mileage reimbursement 14 program on September 1, 2021; now, therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 17 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 18 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 19 Education is requested to work expeditiously to achieve the 20 21 following: 22 Immediately provide bus service to all students in the 23 (1) Pearl City School District who are currently on the 24 25 waitlist for bus services; 26 27 (2) Identify schools in the Pearl City School District that lack regular transportation services; 28 29 Utilize smaller buses and lower route ridership to 30 (3) maximize transportation options for students; 31 32 33 (4)Enhance direct outreach opportunities between the Department of Education, schools, and parents to 34 35 discuss changing demographics and transportation needs in the district; 36 37 (5) Develop a bus driver and commercial driver license 38 training and feeder program; 39 40
