SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO RECOGNIZE THAT GAME MAMMALS AND BIRDS PROVIDE A SUSTAINABLE FOOD SOURCE AND THAT EACH DEPARTMENT, AGENCY, AND OFFICE OF THE STATE INCORPORATE LOCAL HUNTING AND FISHING INDUSTRIES INTO ITS FOOD SUSTAINABILITY STRATEGY.

WHEREAS, supply chain disruptions and rising food prices 1 across the United States have highlighted the need for greater 2 food security and self-sufficiency; and 3 4 WHEREAS, a significant percentage of the food consumed in 5 Hawaii is imported into the State; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Hawaii's reliance on imported food makes the State 8 particularly vulnerable to supply chain disruptions, which can 9 leave many residents of Hawaii without access to affordable 10 food; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the State has taken many steps to increase food self-sufficiency, including increased agricultural production; 14 15 and 16 17 WHEREAS, it is essential for the State's food selfsufficiency strategies to be sustainable; and 18 19 WHEREAS, game mammals and birds offer a plentiful and 20 sustainable food source for Hawaii's residents; and 21 22 WHEREAS, greater recognition of game mammals and birds as a 23 food source would greatly benefit the State's food self-24 sufficiency and sustainability goals; now, therefore, 25 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the 28 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land 29 and Natural Resources is requested to recognize that: 30

1 Game mammals and birds provide a sustainable food 2 (1) 3 source; provided that negative impacts to the environment are sufficiently minimized or offset 4 through native ecosystem protections that merit 5 quality habitats with sufficient food, water, and 6 7 refuge to support viable game mammal and game bird 8 populations sufficient for hunting; 9 10 (2) Proper management of game populations in appropriate areas minimizes or reduces impacts to agriculture, 11 important watershed areas, and native habitats, and 12 provides benefits such as reducing grass fire fuel and 13 14 weed control to important watershed areas; and 15 16 (3) The State's unique relationship with the ocean requires careful consideration and management of land 17 18 and ocean activities that prioritize the public trust responsibilities of the State, including the 19 20 conservation of natural resources for future generations and the protection of native Hawaiian 21 traditional and customary practices pursuant to 22 article XI, section 1, and article XII, section 7, of 23 24 the Hawaii State Constitution; and 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each department, agency, and 26 office of the State is requested to incorporate local hunting 27 28 and fishing industries into any food security or sustainability 29 strategies developed or implemented by that agency; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the head of each principal department of the State is requested to submit to the 32 Legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 33 the Regular Sessions of 2023 and 2024, a report on the progress 34 35 of that department and any agency administratively attached to that department in incorporating local hunting and fishing 36 37 industries in its food security and sustainability strategies, including any findings, recommendations, and proposed 38 39 legislation; and 40
