## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING 2022 AS "MALAMA MAKUAHINE: YEAR OF THE MOTHER".

WHEREAS, aloha starts at home in Hawaii, and the 1 institution of the family provides tremendous value to both its 2 members and the world, deserving the highest priority as the 3 foundation of a peaceful society; and 4 5 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, ohana is the family social unit created 6 by blood, marriage, or adoption (hanai), and can be both 7 nuclear, encompassing parents and children, and extended, 8 9 encompassing other relatives, with bonds that last for generations, and must be protected; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, mothers are the makuahine, the female backbone of the family; therefore, we must malama, care for 13 their health and wellbeing; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the status of a woman is directly related to the 16 status of her mother, and the connection to the ohana is the key 17 18 to a child's genealogy and identity; and 19 WHEREAS, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity, 20 or marital status, mothers have always moved our society and the 21 world forward and remained steadfast in their pursuit of a 22 better and brighter future for the next generation; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, the work of mothers is of paramount importance but 26 is often undervalued, underappreciated, and unpaid; and 27 28 WHEREAS, mothers have an indispensable role as essential workers in the rebuilding and transforming of the modern world 29 30 and society; and 31 32 WHEREAS, mothers have been the most adversely affected by the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, shouldering 33

home, work, childcare, and teaching responsibilities while being 1 2 affected by health issues, a rise in domestic violence, and 3 massive unemployment; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that over 140,000 children in the United States have 6 7 lost a parent or care giver due to COVID-19; and 8 9 WHEREAS, multiple demands are causing working mothers to 10 abandon the workforce at four times the rate of men according to a September 2020 U.S. Labor Department Report; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, mothers in Hawaii often face gender stereotypes 14 and bias in society and yet they still blaze new paths, open up new possibilities, and widen the circles of opportunity for 15 their children despite their challenges; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, the importance of the role of motherhood and the 19 sanctity of the family must be supported with equality and justice within all facets of government and society; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, as children of the Earth, we must protect it for future generations, and as Pope Francis said in 2021, we are 23 called "to listen to the groans of Mother Earth"; now, 24 therefore, 25 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 28 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the House of Representatives concurring, that this body recognizes 29 30 2022 as Malama Makuahine: Year of the Mother; and 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the people of Hawaii are urged 32 33 to express their love, respect, malama (care), and gratitude to 34 mothers everywhere with appropriate events, programs, ceremonies, roundtables, and activities throughout the State of 35 Hawaii; and 36 37 38
